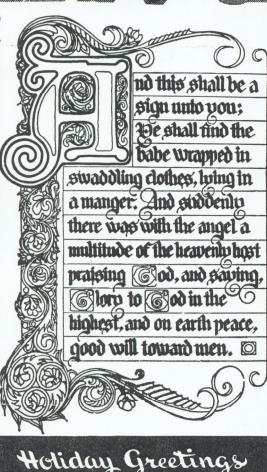

The New Testament In Modern Hebrew

It has been regarded by Hebrew scholars both in Israel and abroad as a masterpiece. Delitzsch had sought the constant advice of fellow Jews who were at home in both rabbinic and Biblical Hebrew. However, the revival of Hebrew as a spoken language had not yet come about.

Dr. Robert Lindsey, a Baptist Biblical scholar who first came to Jerusalem in 1939, has been a leading figure in the quest for a translation into the Hebrew spoken today. When he published "A Hebrew Translation of the Gospel of Mark" in 1969, Professor David Flusser of the Hebrew University, with whom Lindsey has worked closely for many years, wrote the foreword.

Lindsey's translation of Mark (only a small portion of the New Testament) raised the issues with which the subsequent translation committee had to struggle. Lindsey's concern was that his translation be in "language which ade-quately reflects the early Jewish-Christian linguistic scene and will give literary pleasure as well as understanding." Amazingly, no criticism of the Hebrew text of Lindsey's translation has been made by Hebrew-speaking

The new translation, encompassing the new translation, encompassing the entire New Testament, has been done primarily by a native-born Israeli, a graduate in Semitic languages from the Hebrew University, in close cooperation with a team of Hebrew specialists from throughout Israel. The committee was headed by Magne committee was headed by Magne Solheim, who until retirement was Executive Secretary of the Bible Society in Israel. Manuscripts were submitted to non-Christian Hebrew scholars for detailed criticism before the final draft was approved.

How contemporary should a modern translation be? Should one use the language of the average person on the street? The New Testament in Modern Hebrew tries to bring both a true and intelligible rendering of the Greek text while being easily readable for the average Israeli. Effort has been made to produce a text which is natural and unambiguous, while being faithful to the meaning of the original

What was the original? Several Jerusalem scholars believe that Hebrew originals of the New Testament biographics of Jesus (the Gospels) lie be-hind the Greek text. "The extra-ordinary richness of Matthew and Luke is due to the treasury of Hebraic stories which they preserve and which clearly go back to eyewitness memories of Jesus," asserts Lindsey. If this is true, it makes even more fascinating the journey from early, long-lost Hebrew documents to the new translation in Modern Hebrew.

Fortress of Gamla 2,000 Year Old **Ruins Emerge**

GAMLA Occupied Syria-The ruins of a once-mighty Jewish fortress city have emerged from the camel-shaped hillside after which it is believed to have been given its name: Gamla.

It was here in the year 68 A.D. that the Roman legions of Emperor Vespasian made their first major dent in Jewish resistance, a hard-won success that opened the way to Jerusalem, which fell two years later.

The Gamla epic survived two millennia, largely because of the in-credibly accurate description of the Jewish-Roman war penned by a renegade Hebrew historian, Josephus Flavius, a witness to the defeat and dis-

persion of his people.

Archeologist Shmarya Gutmann used Josephus' narrative as a guide to the long-buried site of Gamla, pinpointing it with the help of a fellow collective farmer.

His first season of excavations, carried out under incredibly difficult conditions, revealed the once-impregnable city's defensive wall, a stone stairway that served as one of its streets and a remarkably big public building that may prove to be the oldest synagogue ever uncovered.

Gutmann, a white-haired man in his late sixties who can climb up and down the rocky slopes of Gamla with the ease of a teenager, believes the historical importance of his find will rival that of Massada, the mesa overlooking the Dead Sea where the Jewish rebels made

their last stand.

He helped the famous Yigael Yadin, Israel's best-known archeologist, work on the massive Massada dig.

The difference between Massada and Gamla, Gutmann says, is that the former went through several changes, serving as the site of several Byzantine Christian churches, palaces of King Herod, and other stages.

"Gamla existed as a Jewish city only from the time of its construction, starting in the 4th Century B.C. until its fall," he said, surveying the newly ex-

posed stone landscape.

Gutmann believes the Romans had good reason to lay siege on Gamla before moving westward towards Jeru-

salem.

"They—especially Vespasian and his n, Titus—knew that the country could be conquered only if its provinces were subdued piece by piece," he explained.

"Therefore," he went on, "in true

Roman fashion, they worked systematically to crush the then-large Jewish community in the Golan Heights, Gilead and the Bashan Region, moved into Galilee and finally closed in on Jerusalem and Massada."

Then, as now, the Golan was Israel's first line of defense.

During 45 days of digging under an unrelenting summer sun, Gutmann and his dedicated corps of young kibbutz volunteers—the exception was a 74-year-old kibbutz engineer "who worked hardest of all"--scores of stone ballistic missiles were plucked from the ground.

Gutmann also found arrowheads which, like the stone missiles, were catapulted by the Romans at the defenders.

The public building, which measures more than 20 feet in width and 100 in length, had three tiers of precisely cut stone seats around its rectangular floor.

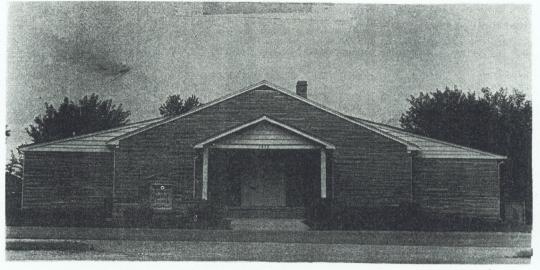

at the age of 13 years, I joined the Church I was used to attending, where I had attended Sunday School and other services all of my life. I was baptized by the Pastor, Dr. D. B. Clapp, who is now in glory. But I was only a lad then.

Now that I am grown and mature, and capable of thinking and weighing evidence, and making decisions for myself on the basis of that evidence, the fact that I was raised a Baptist is not sufficient reason for my remaining a Baptist. I must have reasons, good and sufficient, for remaining a Baptist, and those reasons should not be based upon prejudice, nor sentiment, but upon premises that are valid and certain and incontrovertible, and which will pass scrutiny in the light of Scripture.

WELL, THEN, WHY AM I A BAPTIST?

(1) I am a Baptist because I want to be a member of a Church that goes by the Whole Bible, — that recognizes the Inspiration and Authority of the Bible. I want NO human creeds, nor dogmas, to direct my thinking.

The Bible is the One Authority in all matters of Faith and Practice. In 2 Timothy 3:16-17 we read that "all scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for Doctrine, Reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be perfect and throughly furnished for every good work" that he is to do. Also Isaiah 8:20 says "to the law and to the testimony; if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

It is always been a proverb with us that "If it is in the Bible its Baptist, and if it is Baptist it is in the Bible." This is my first, and really the all-inclusive reason why I am now a Baptist.

(II) I am a Baptist because I want to be a member of a Church that teaches — A. Salvation by Grace, Through Faith, Without Works. This doctrine is so definitely and clearly taught in Ephesians 2:8-10; Romans 3:28; 4:5; 5:1; Romans 10:1-4, 9, 10, 13-17. In carefully examining the many different denominations I find that true Missionary Baptists are the only ones who really teach this Bible Doctrine as one of their major tenets.

Many years ago, I made the statement that Missionary Baptists were the only denomination that preaches Salvation By Grace, Through Faith, and Without Works at all. A good friend of mine accosted me later and said that I had over-stepped myself, and said, "We Primitive Baptists preach that." I replied, No, you don't; you preach salvation by grace, and without works, but you omit the "through faith"; you make him saved before faith, in the predestinating purposes of God." He had to admit that I was right.

- B. THE ABSOLUTE NECESSITY OF REGENERATION. Such scriptures as John 3:3-8 show the necessity of the New-birth. Also John 1:11-13; Galations 6:15; and 2 Corinthians 5:17. These all show that a person MUST BE BORN AGAIN, and I believe it for it is in the Bible, and Baptists teach it, and that is another outstanding reason why I am a Baptist.
- C. I want to be a member of a church that teaches THE SECURITY OF THE SAVED. I find this in the Bible in John 10:27-30; 2 Timothy 2:12; Romans 8:35-39; Hebrews 7:25; Jude 24; I Peter

1:3-5, and many other places. I find also that Baptist Churches teach the Doctrine of the Eternal Security of the believer, and so I am a Baptist, and preach this doctrine with all joy. It is one of my most precious beliefs.

— D. Baptist Churches teach THE ASSURANCE OF SALVATION; that salvation is a know-so experience. Baptist churches teach along with the Bible that a person can be saved and know it. See I John 3:14; 5:13; 2 Corinthians 5:21; in John 9:25 the man who had been born blind and whose sight Jesus had restored, which is a picture of salvation, said, "One thing I know, whereas I was blind, now I see." This certainly corroborates the teaching that a person can know that they are saved.

I believe in a heart-felt religion. Romans 5:5 says "The love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit," and Romans 8:16-17 tells us that "the Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God." Baptists teach this kind of religion; it's what I believe the Bible teaches, and so, therefore, I could be nothing else but a Baptist.

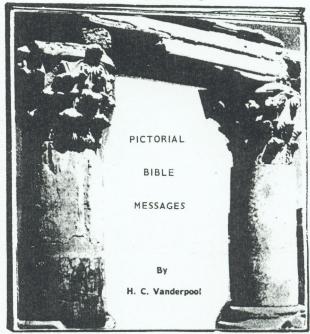
- E. I must be a member of a church that preaches JESUS ONLY AS A SAV-IOUR. I find that the Bible teaches that that there is ONE MEDIATOR between God and man, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself a ransom for all. And in John 14:6, Jesus said that no one could come to the Father but by Himself; and in Acts 4:12 there is no salvation in any other, for there is none other name under heaven, given among men whereby one can be saved. And in careful, and close examination of the doctrine of other church bodies I find that true Baptists are the only ones who consistently stand for the truth.

Now, there may be individual preachers within other denominations who preach these truths, but the Doctrines of those denominations are not built around these truths, and it is for that reason I could not affiliate myself with any other Church body except a Baptist Church.

(III) I am a Baptist because I want to be a member of a church THAT RECOG-NIZES THE LORDSHIP AND HEAD-SHIP OF JESUS CHRIST. Ephesians 1:20-22 tells me that God gave Him to be head over all things to the Church, which is His body. This means that no man, nor set of men as a board, or presbytery, or conference, or religious heirarchy, is to be head over His Church. I want to be in a church that is left free from human entanglements, free to do anything that it honestly and sincerely feels led by the Lord to do; and that can give its Missionary and Benevolent support where it feels that God directs it to give, and not be directed by some board. "Giving no offense in any thing, that the ministry be not blamed" (II Cor. 6:3).

Newspapers, magazines, and TV programs have shocked many honest, thinking people with the deceitful and unscrupulous methods used by a number of religious sects to raise funds and win converts to their particular cult. Many an unwary individual has been taken in, not knowing what he has been taken in to. The "Moonies" boast of having received over 10,000 young people, half of whom are said to be Jewish. Do these figures prove results or "fruit"?

In the parable of the sower (Matt. 13:1-9) the Lord speaks of "results" in verse 5. However, the "results" were not lasting, as there was "no deepness of earth." In verse 8 we read of "fruit" which was the result of preparing the soil and properly planting the seed. Christian workers should learn that there are no short cuts to a sound, lasting ministry of soul winning.

One of the dilemmas of our day is that some Christian organizations have adopted the methods and practices of these false cults, of whom the Apostle Paul wrote, "They lie in wait to deceive" (Eph. 4:14). In the apostle's prayer for the Philippians he prays, "That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ" (Phil. 1:10). How important to "approve things that are excellent." This does not only mean that we should be able to discern between right and wrong, but rather that we should know how to choose the highest as opposed to the mediocre. The old philosophy that "the end justifies the means" has no place in the Christian ministry. Paul writes in I Cor. 6:12 that "All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient."

The apostle continues his prayer by saying, "that ye may be sincere and without offense." The word "sincere" comes from two Latin words, sine (without) and cera (wax)—without wax. The ancients had a unique method for firing porcelain. Because of the great heat required in obtaining the desired results, it was difficult to fire the porcelain without cracking it. The dishonest dealer would use a special was to fill in the cracks so the unwary customer would be deceived. If the waxed vase was held up to the light, however, the cracks could be detected. Thus the honest dealer would mark his wares "sine cera" (without wax).

The apostle uses this illustration to remind the child of God that anything that is questionable or savors of sham and hypocrisy should be done away with so that we will be "without offense till the day of Christ." He knew that any form of deception in the ministry would be offensive to those who were the objects of His grace, and the ministry would be blamed (II Cor. 6:3).

May the Lord give us the spirit of discernment so that we may be able to choose the highest, shun the mediocre, and trust Him to "give the increase" (I Cor. 3:7).
