Life In Christ Jesus Is Everlasting

"He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life; and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abideth on Him." John 3:36.

There is nothing in this great statement of Scripture that is in the least hard to understand; for it is clearly stated as to what kind of life the believer has. It is not the kind that endures for a while and then come to an end. In fact, if it were to come to an end it wouldn't be everlasting life; everlasting means enduring forever, in-definitely, without end.

I believe that this life in Christ Jesus can be further clarified when contrasted with our natural life, which, of course, is not eternal. When we were born into this world our parents didn't give us everlasting life; we are born to die. As Job said, "Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble. He cometh forth like a flower and is cut down; he fleeth also like a shadow, and continueth not." Job 14:1-2. But the real believer in Jesus Christ is born again, and unlike the natural birth he is born of an

Jesus Prays For His Own

Lesson: John 17:1-26

We notice in this great prayer that Jesus prayed after he had come to the world, and had finished his work in which he had come to do; and was about to ascend back to God the father, he prayed for his own. He included you and I that have been saved, or born again. These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father the hour is come; glorify thy son, that thy son also may glorify thee: The hour had come, the hour of his completed suffering on the cross was finished, and the hour had come, that the son of man should be glorified.

Christ did not seek some honor here for his own sake, for in his own glorification through death, resurrection and exaltation, or being lifted up; he sought only to glorify the father. Glorify thy son, in his exaltation as mediator to be head over all things to the church. Paul speaks to the church at Ephesus saying: God hath put all things under his feet (Christ), and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all. (Ephesians 1:22-23) Paul in speaking to the church at Philippi said: Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Philippians 2:9-11) Jesus said in his humble prayer to God, glorify thy son, that thy son also may glorify thee: (John 17-1) Peter and the other apostles said: Christ hath God exalted with his right hand to be a prince and a saviour, for to give repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. (Acts 5:31) This glorification of the Father includes in it the elevation of the Son to glory and power, where he is head over all things. Power over all flesh; all mankind as sinful and guilty. The prophet Daniel had this to say: And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him, his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that shall not be destroyed. (Daniel 7-14)

We notice that Jesus has all power. Jesus said: All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. (Matt. 28:18) He has power to give life, for through him and him alone we are saved. Peter said in speaking to the people, and elders of Israel: Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved. (Acts 4-12) Jesus said: All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me. I will in no wise cast out. For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me. And this is the Father's will which hath sent me. That of all which he hath given me I should lost nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day. (John 6-37-40) Eternal life is set forth in terms of knowing God. The Jews did not know God, though they knew much about him.

And this is eternal life, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hath sent (John 17-3) It is the claim of this verse and this whole gospel that the knowledge of God which brings eternal life comes only through the knowledge of the Son. John said: And we know that we are of God, and the whole

world lieth in wickedness. And we know that the son of God is come, and hath given us an understanding, that we may know him that is true, even in his son Jesus Christ. This is the true God, and eternal life (I John 5-19-20)

Since the Father and the Son are one, the knowledge is one. The knowledge of God implies the knowledge of his ways, as well as of his person, And so includes the perception (or understanding) of his plan of salvation from sin. This knowledge is eternal life. Peter had this to say concerning this great knowledge: According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: That by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corrupted that is in the world through lust. (II Peter 1:3-4)

Jesus said: I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do.

And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with the before the world was. (John 17:4-

Jesus looks at this moment upon his whole work on earth, including his sacrificial death as finished, and the work the Father gave him to do which included: The choice and the sending out of the twelve apostles, the establishment, or setting up of the church kingdom, and the revelation of God the Father.

revelation of God the Father.

Jesus having spoken of his work on the earth, now sought glorification with the Father in the heavenly realm, so the contrast (or likness of the Father) is double consisting of place and person.

My friends it is plain to see that Christ has already fully accomplished the work of salvation, and has gone back to God the Father, and is there making intercession for the people of God. The plan was made complete and is sufficient (or is adequate for the purpose) to all that will come believing in him.

In closing, permit me to call your attention to a verse recorded by Jesus in this very humbled prayer that he prayed. Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word. (John 17-20) This prayer reaches out to include those who will believe because of the testimony of these men and women, boys and girls that have experienced salvation and have tasted the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost.

And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come.

we want to take this means to bring you up to date on the work here. We want to begin by saying that we appreciate Bro. Vanderpool and his work in preparing the Banner. We enjoy reading articles about work back home and about missionaries on other fields.

Our first few weeks in Japan were like a whirlwind. Everything seemed to go wrong but with every trial the Lord gave the needed strength. We came to this small town of Karuizawa and moved into the house that I had rented during my previous trip. The house was a mess and all the plumbing was bursted. We went to work and by and by it started to look like home. Our most valuable items were a small tape player and a few gospel music tapes. We would play the tapes over and over until the batteries would run down. A little later our furniture and other items began to arrive and we were really-happy. This was a wonderful experience for us because many things that we had taken for granted before, now made us very

thankful. Such a little thing as hot water became a precious item and a reason to thank the Lord.

The primary reason we came to Karuizawa is to study the language. There is a very good Japanese Language School in Karuizawa. They offer a two year course in the language and customs. We feel that the Lord wants us to have the

entire course. All of the teachers are christians and they are eager for the gospel to be preached. Each class is started by prayer and reading the Bible is the first item of each morning. I enjoy studying under such good conditions.

After we had been here two months, I was about to burst because I wanted to tell someone about my Lord. I was becoming very discouraged but just when I needed it, the Lord opened a door-of utterance. I was asked to have a Bible study with four junior high English teachers. Oh, was I happy and the Lord blessed the study. I would tell them over and over about Jesus and each time was so precious to me. I still have this class and now the Lord has blessed me with four more weekly classes. I'm very busy, that is, with the language study and the Bible studies, but I'm happy to be busy for my Lord. He is coming again and I believe we should be hard at work. Please pray that my strength will continue to be sufficient to meet all these various responsibilities. I like the verse of scripture that says "though the outward man persih, yet the inward man is renewed day by day.

Please pray for the people that I meet The Lord is working with weekly. conviction in their hearts.

I have had the opportunity to preach and witness every week for the last several months. My congregation has been as small as one or as many as thirty. I have witnessed in houses, schools, streets, trains, restaurant-well, just about anywhere. I get some laughs and strange looks, but I love these people and I don't mind the strange looks.



Well, 1978 rolled around and I hadn't seen any fruit. I was becoming impatient but all I knew to do was to "stand still and see the salvation of the Lord."

On the first day of February, 1978, a young girl was saved. She had been in one of my classes. Her name is Yoko, I think I could have leaped to Tennessee. The Lord had glorified His name and filled our hearts with joy. Please continue to pray for Yoko that she will grow in the Lord.

The Lord is leading us to southern Japan. We don't know exactly where yet, but He will show us in His own time. Pray that we will follow wherever it may be. We want to be where the Lord wants us to go.

I want to express my thanks to all of you for your prayers and support. We are all working together in this mission effort. You all are just as much a part of this work as my family and myself. Please pray daily for the Japanese people. Pray for my family. Helen has been and is a brave soldier but she needs your prayers. Gene and Ray Wilson are really growing and they are a joy to us.

It has been our pleasure to tell you about the happiest year of our lives. So, thanks to all but most of all thanks be unto God for His unspeakable gift.

I wish to thank all ministers, laymen, churches, writers, supporters and every concerned person who has by prayers, money and labor made this publication possible to our people for these past twelve years. I ask everyone for your continued support as we begin our 13th year next --- Editor

Antioch Church Sounded Forth Missions, Acts 13:1-4.

They were founded upon missions, and grounded upon missions; it wasn't anything but natural for them to begin sounding forth missions. Barnabas, Saul, and the other brethren named were vitally concerned about missions in other places and as a result, three things took

place very shortly.

A. Missionaries were sought, verse 1-2a. They didn't place a notice in the Want Ads for missionaries; rather they sought them from the Lord. These men believed in a divine call to the ministry and to missions so they prayed to the Lord of the harvest. Surely when they prayed for missionaries, they must have considered the possibility that anyone of them might be chosen of the Lord for the work. When we pray for workers and Missionaries, we can only pray aright when we are willing to go ourselves.

B. Missionaries were separated, verse 2b. As these men prayed, ministered, and fasted, the Holy Spirit revealed God's will by choosing Barnabas and Saul to be separated or set aside for mission work. What a solemn occasion — men prayed and God called! Surely the hearts these men were humbled before the Lord. God's method of choosing mission-aries (or preachers for that matter) has not changed one iota since that early day. Other mission work had been done on a somewhat limited scale, but this day inaugurated a world-wide missionary endeavor.

C. Missionaries were sent, verses 3-4. they fasted and prayed again; then they ordained them as missionaries through the laying on of hands. Then they sent them forth with their prayers and support be-hind them. Saul and Barnabas left Antioch and went by land to Seleucia from whence they set sail to the island called Cyprus. Thus began Paul's first mission-

ary journey.

CONCLUSION—Because of a missionminded group of men, the Antioch church was organized. Begun with a missionary zeal, the church at Antioch soon became the home base for the mission work of Paul, Barnabas, Silas, and many other men of God. Is your church a "base" for mission work? If it is, pray that it will continue to grow in that direction; if it isn't pray and work that it may become one.

When one becomes a new creature in Christ Jesus he should be careful that his steps are ordered by the Lord, as the Apostle Paul plainly tells us in Gal. 5:24-26, "and they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. Let us not be desirous of vain glory provoking one another, envying another

If we are to accomplish the purpose the Lord has for us we must heed the statements found in Phil. 2:5-7, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus. Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men."

When one desires or leaves the impression that he desires to dominate others, it creates friction and destroys the spiritual fellowship which is so essential to our labouring together with God. We are not to be lords over God's heritage.

The flesh has a tendency to desire vain

glory and provoke and envy others. If we live after the Spirit the mind of Christ will dominate our lives. We then can truly bear one another's burdens and fulfill the law of Christ. Jesus rebuked the disciples for striving about who should be accounted the greatest, and said the one that serves should be accounted chief. When the mind of Christ controls our lives, we are willing to acknowledge by word and deed that he is our master and we desire his worthy name to be exalted among men to the glory of God the Father.

When we become carnally minded there is a desire for personal glory and envy of anyone who may enjoy a close fellowship with their brethren and sisters. Some are moved with so great envy as to try to

destroy those they envy.
Our Lord warned us as what to expect when he said, "Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves: be ye therefore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves," Matt. 10:16. We are taught to refrain from violence, but remain on guard. We are to earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints. Our goal should always be as stated II John 2, "For the truth's sake, which dwelleth in us, and shall be with us forever." We should never yield to temptation to receive a personal benefit while we pretend to be labouring for the truth's sake.

We should never compromise the truth as Pro. 23:23a states, "Buy the truth and sell it not." However, we should never abuse others as stated in I Cor. 10:31-32, "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God. Give none offence neither to the Jews, nor to the Gentiles, nor to the church of God

We are warned to be careful to speak the ruth, "Wherefore putting away lying. speak every man truth with his neighbor: for we are members one of another. Eph. 4:25.
