OLD FASHION GOSPEL HOUR TELECAST

The Old Fashion Gospel Hour Telecast has been sponsored by Missionary Baptist Churches for the past two or three years, which originated at Crossville. Tenn. and was then extended into other states. Recently another station, KLOC Madesta, California was added. The station is in northern California and produces 5 million watts, the third most powerfu station in the nation and is the 23rd largest market in the United States. A DETERMINED COURSE

Paul was a man and a servant of God with great courage, he didn't let persecutions and hardships, and even threats on his life turn him around, for he was determined to finish the course that God had set him on. Listen to what he says here: "And now, behold, I go bound in the Spirit unto Jerusalem, not knowing the things that shall befall me there; save that the Holy Ghost witnesseth in every city, saying that bonds and afflictions abide me. But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy, and the ministry, which I have received of the Lord Jesus to testify the Gospel of the grace of God." Acts 20:22-24. The apostle wasn't boasting here when he said, "None of these things move me" The answer as to how he could say such a thing is found in the words, "I go bound in the Spirit unto Jerusalem" It was the Spirit's power that gave him such courage and determination to go on and finish his course. The great power of the Spirit can cause us to lose sight of ourselves and think only of what pleases our Lord and I know, and you know that this is one of the great needs of our day.

Paul said this: "So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the Gospel to you that are at Rome also.' 1:15. Paul didn't fight with bitter and hateful words and deeds, but he fought with weapons that almighty God placed at his disposal, he fought to do nobody any physical or mental injury, he must have remembered the words of God. "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, saith the Lord." Anybody who fights with the armour of God can go to bed at night with a good conscience and sleep undisturbed, and enjoy the peace of God in his heart, rise from sleep the next morning refreshed and ready to go again. God can soothe our consciences and give us His wonderful peace, or He can disturb us till we can't sleep. And I am sure that anybody that has been in His service very long knows that.

Paul's fight was a long one, from the time that he was converted until the end of life. It started there in Damascus when the Jews sought to kill him, for no other reason than that he was preaching the Christ that he had been persecuting, "Then was Paul certain days with the disciples which were at Damascus. And Straightway he preached Christ in the synagogues, that He is the Son of God." Acts 9:19,20. "And after many days were fulfilled, the Jews took counsel to kill him " Acts 9:23. The best weapon that we can use in this spiritual warefare is the one that Paul used. He mentions that powerful weapon in his letter to the Ephesians, "And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God." Ephesians 6:17. As the great apostle marched in the battle he went with the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God; and that is why he could say, "I have fought a good fight" It was a winning fight, and the dear Lord let him know that there was a reward laid up for him, for he said, by the inspiration of the Spirit: "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord the righteous judge, shall give me at that day:" II Timothy 4:8. Even though he fell in battle, it was a good fight, not an evil one, and the good fruits of his fight is still evident today. Yes, it was a rugged course, but a very fruitful one.

A FAITHFUL COURSE

"I have kept the faith" Paul never wavered to the right or to the left from the Word of God, declaring all the Counsel of God, "For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God." Acts 20:27. He didn't have just certain pet subjects to declare, but he just went right down the line telling it just like it is; preaching how to be saved; preaching how to live a Christian life, separate from the world; he preached great doctrinal messages about the church and its great ordinances. He preached much about the grace of God, how that we are saved by grace through faith, and that not of ourselves, not of works, lest any man should boast, (Eph. 2:8-10;) What he said about himself: "But by the grace of God I am what I am" I Cor. 15:10; Yes, and he preached and wrote about the great doctrine of eternal security of God's children, how that there is no condemnation to them who are in Christ Jesus, (Rom. 8:1) that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus; (Rom. 8:35-39) Paul preached and practiced just what he admonished Timothy to do, "Preach the Word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exort with all long suffering and doctrine." II Timothy 4:2.

A REWARDING COURSE

It is very true that Paul had many hardships, many sorrows, heart aches, pain and suffering in his weak body of flesh; but he rejoiced anyway, he even sang praises to the Lord in times of severe trials. When he and Silas were in Philippi they were beaten with many stripes and cast into prison, and their feet made fast in stocks, but back there in the dark prison, with their backs bleeding, and no doubt in severe pain they prayed and sang praises to the Lord, (Acts 16:22-25.) There was pain, yes, there was distress of mind, of course; but in the midst of such circumstances there was joy in their hearts, because they were suffering for the Lord, and the dear Lord was flooding them with joy unspeakable and full of glory; and they were able to sing

praises to His good name. Only a true child of God can understand this, but we know and can understand how these dear servants of the Lord could rejoice, though in pain.

Not only was Paul's course rewarding to him in this life, but he tells of what is laid up for him in that great day when the Lord shall come and reward His servants. Here is what he said: "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give at that day; and not to me only, but unto all them also that love His appearing." II Timothy 4:8. As I think of this I want to say, as the Psalmist said, "Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name." Psalm 103:1.

More Remains Uncovered At the Town Where Samson Raised Havoc

The tel pokes out of a cottonfield in the middle of the Sorek Valley. The sloping ramps that surround it suggest that it was originally thrown up as a fortress in the middle of terrain offering no natural position for fortification. Its proximity to the railway line to Jerusalem suggests that it was built to guard the ancient route between the coastal plain and Jerusalem that roughly followed the same path.

Its modern Arabic name is Tel Batash, and scholars say this is the biblical Timna where Samson slew a lion, picked a Philistine wife, and raised almighty havoc when his father-in-law passed the bride on to someone else during Samson's absence. Archaeological excavations were launched there last year by three American institutions of higher learning in collaboration with the Hebrew University.

The tel, near Moshav Tel Shahar, had originally been identified with the Philistine city of Ekron. In 1956, however, a new survey placed Ekron several kilometres to the west and identified Tel Batash with Timna.

The original Canaanite city at the bottom of the tel was found to have been destroyed by fire about 1200 BCE. This was the time when the Israelites under Joshua were spilling down from the central mountain chain to the west and the Philistines were landing on the coast to the east.

"We don't know who burnt it," said Ami Mazar of the Hebrew University, who served as field director under Dr. George Kelm of the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, the expedition's director.

It was, however, clearly the Philistines who settled on the city. A typical Philistine house and Philistine ceramics have been found above the burnt-out layer. Also found was a clay seal or bulla used to enclose papyrus.

It is the altar of my devotion, the birth of my faith, the center of my affection, and the foretaste of Heaven.


I have united with it in solemn covenant, pledging myself to attend its services, to pray for its members, to give to its support, to obey its laws.

Town Built by Judean Kings Found in South

A large and well-fortified town built by Judean kings was uncovered by Prof. Moshe Kochavi's archaeological team at Tel Ira, on the southern slopes of the Hebron hills, Tel Aviv University announced recently.

Participating in the digs, which were to recover archaeological remains in an area earmarked for an airfield, were teams from Tel Aviv, Bar-Ilan, and Ben-Gurion Universities, as well as the Allegheny University, the University of Pennsylvania, and Rice University in the U.S.

The Judean town was built over the remains of a Canaanite settlement by Kings Uzziah and Hezekiah in the eighth century BCE. The biggest fortifications date from the times of King Manasseh in the seventh century BCE. The town was some 30 dunams in area, protected by a casemate wall—a thick defensive wall on the outside and a thinner wall inside, with storage rooms and living quarters between them

Among the objects found were weightsone inscribed with the letters "pim," while another was identified as one

The Menassian city was destroyed twice by fire-once in the seventh century and again in the sixth century BCE, around the time of the destruction of the First Temple.

Tel Ira continued to be inhabited, however. Returnees from Babylon settled there in the fifth and fourth centuries BCE, but it gained its greatest importance in the Hellenistic period, when a new protective wall was constructed.

The city was abandoned soon after the Arab conquest, in the seventh century CE

Bro. Pitt said, "Our mail has been tremendous from viewers and we have heard of people getting saved in various parts of the country."
