Paul wrote, "But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you." Romans 8:11. "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall change our vile body, that

it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself." Philippians 3:20-21.

THE EMPTY TOMB

A Moslem once boasted to a Christian: "When Moslems go to Mecca, they find there at least a coffin, but when Christians go to Jerusalem, they find only an empty grave."

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***** A PROVERB OF SOLOMON

"Surely the churning of milk bringeth forth butter, and the wringing of the nose bringeth forth blood: so the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife.

Proverbs 30:33

Solomon observed that certain actions lead to predictable results in this verse from the book of Proverbs. If one desires butter, he must churn or agitate the milk. If he doesn't desire butter, he will not churn the milk, as he is aware that in doing so, he will most surely end up with butter. The churning of the milk causes it to change in both texture and taste. He must exert energy to produce the end result - butter. This exertion of energy will necessarily involve thought and premeditation. He is aware of the end result.

The wringing of the nose will produce a nosebleed. Few, if any, enjoy nosebleeds and will therefore avoid wringing of the nose, knowing full well that it will bring discomfort and annoyance. Again, this is not an accidental action, but one in-



as well as fulfill everything that he has promised. When he could swear by no greater, he swore by himself. (Heb. 6:13)

WHAT GOD IS TO HIS PEOPLE

In trying to give a description of what God is, is like trying to describe everything you have ever seen in life, because God made everything. Isaiah put in prophetic form, even before Christ came to this world, something that he would be to his people. "The government shall be upon his shoulder" (Isaiah 9:6). Because God is almighty, he is Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. For the Lord of hosts hath purposed, and who shall disannul it? (Isaiah 14:27). He has all power in heaven and in

These and many more teach us that he is a refuge, a very present help in the time of trouble. He is not limited with time and space as our earthly help would be. For instance he never bothers with sleep in the night, that would be no barrier that he could not get to us soon enough "a very present help". It is just good to know the Lord under any circumstances.

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some thought and premeditation. It is inconsistent to think that forced wrath will produce peace, harmony and unity. We know from experience what the end result will be, as we did with the first two examples. Nonetheless, some will exert much energy to force wrath and yet cannot understand why strife would ensue. They look for even the least hint of wrath, force it and expect to produce a comfortable result. When this occurs over and over a clear pattern emerges which ought not to be disregarded. Wrath so forced can make even the most patient and long suffering individual impatient and irrational.

Wrath can often lead to quick decisions not based upon reason and acts and words inconsistent with the general character of a man. This, however, is a predictable result whenever wrath is forced. Those who make a habit of forcing wrath will often use the predicted results to justify themselves before other men. "Just look at what he did! . . . Do you know what he said? . . . I can't understand why he dislikes me . . . etc., etc., etc." are common comments in this vein. We too often ask only "What happened?" and willfully disregard the question of "Why did it happen?" Many hear what happened, listening to every detail, but don't wish to "be involved" when someone tries to explain WHY. Whenever we do listen to only one facet, we are involved in some way. If one does not desire to be "involved" in any way he ought not to entertain the speaker of the first part from the beginning.

Strife will cease to exist or at least lessen if wrath is not forced in the beginning. Do not profess a hatred of strife on the one hand, while willfully promoting it with the other. Strife is never profitable, except to our foe, the Devil, who clearly understands the old saying, "Divide and Conquer." May we not only memorize such proverbs as the above by Solomon, but observe the truth of them by our actions.

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NEEDING A SHEPHERD

Lord, send us a Shepherd who is not afraid. One strong in spirit; a soul that's brave. One who will rejoice when we stay near. One who will search when we stray from his care.

Lord, you know who this Shepherd should be. O, you know, a lot better than we. So Lord, why don't you tell him to come to us here. For what will become of the sheep with no Shepherd to care.

Lord, we are pleading this case before you again. Send us a Shepherd; guide him with your mighty hand. This is our prayer; may it never cease. Til this need is met for each.

volving thought and premeditation. We would consider a man a fool who would wring his nose to bring forth blood, as there is discomfort both in the means and the end. There would be no profit in such an action.

The forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife. Both wrath and strife are undesirable and unprofitable in any endeavor in which we are engaged with others. The wrath is forced, not spontaneous. It again requires

rules and supercedes. "And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me." Matt. 10:38. After being saved, a person can do nothing greater than causing lost people to seriously consider where they stand in God's sight. "Then said Jesus unto his disciples. If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow me. For whosoever will save his life, shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it." Matt. 16:24-25; see also Matt. 19:29.

Are we dependable in serving God with our best instrumentality? When we examine salvation with an honest assessment, our first love to the Lord is admonished above any occupation. "Let him know that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death and shall hide a multitude of sins." James 5:20.

Because we can't see instant results isn't always necessarily spelling failure. Our omnipotent God keeps a record. Paul wrote, "I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some." I Cor. 9:22. Sinfully obtaining materialistic gain and pride or popularity doesn't defend the gospel. Testimony or witness by dedicated servants may effect the heart of another many years afterwards, "...not seeking mine own profit, but the

profit of many, that they may be saved." I Cor. 10:33.

Our main priority must be concern about the welfare of people's, souls across the United States of America and entirely worldwide. "Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they might be saved." Rom. 10:1. Let us endeavor to keep watering the gospel that has been planted until God guides a change. "If by any means I may provoke to emulation them which are my flesh, and might save..." Rom. 11:14. Never take these pledges fainthearted nor place a career, institution or pastime before solemn oaths to God.

We are responsible for others who haven't made peace with God. Meeting this requirement takes sacrifice and labor. By sincerely cultivating our salvation, we declare that reconciliation has been achieved as it was previously before reaching the age or time of accountability. Owing indebtedness that is unpayable, we must work for God without reservation. Let's surrender our life capacity in submitting what God has given us to his cause. "... to make the captain (Jesus) of their salvation perfect through sufferings.' Heb. 2:10.

God isn't satisfied with our worship unless we generously turn ourselves over to Him, upholding the gospel of his dear, precious Son, and following the leadership of the Holy Spirit. "Every way of a man is right in his own eyes: but the Lord pondereth the hearts." Pro. 21:2. Never underestimate the application of meaningful impressions that you feel. Carrying a heavy burden especially has a definite purpose. Shouting or spiritual cries cannot be humanly produced with the remarkable supply purely sanctified and bubbling over in the soul.

Our omission not only increases vanity against us, but could hinder an immediate conversion. We must agreeably share our time, efforts and resources combined in addition to altering other civilized activities so that we can use spiritual zeal to channel our God-given energy, reaching out in obligation for lost and dying people. "And if children, then heirs, heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ: if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together." mans 8:17. Never hinder a sinner from being saved or do harmful damage to this heritage and Holy Spirit's purpose as it convicts and reproves. "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." I Tim. 4:16.

Since false teachings can enhance self-righteousness, let clean, chaste, religious friendship prevail my brothers and sisters! Saved people's influence on others is their enduring wealth. Thus, a sensible Chris-

tian learns to practice good living of moral, law-abiding citizenship and love. (Note: Part 4, the conclusion of this article, will be in the next issue in May.)

adulterous generation seekem arter a sign, and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas; For as Jonas (Jonah) was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." Matthew 12:39-40.

Jesus taught in John 11:9 that a day has twelve hours. He also separated the day from darkness. If the day has twelve hours, so does the night. This would simply make twenty-four hours, and three days and three nights would be seventy-two hours. This is the duration of the Lord's stay in the tomb, that is his body.

Jesus was spoken of by David and he wrote concerning him, "Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoiceth: my flesh also shall rest in hope. For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption." Psalm 16:9-10

In the New Testament two words "hades" and "gehenna" have both been translated "hell." If the English word is translated from "gehenna" it means the place of fire, or the place of punishment for the wicked. If the word "hell" is translated from the word "hades" it means the "unseen state, or the unseen world," as the word "sheol" does in the Old Testament.

When David said of Christ, "thou wilt not leave my soul in hell," he did not mean that the soul of Christ would go to the place of fire as some teach, but rather that while

his soul would depart from the body into the unseen world, it would not be left there but would return to the body which would be raised from the dead. To better understand where the soul of Jesus went for three days and three nights, read II Corinthians 12:1-4; Luke 23:43.

Christ was crucified on Wednesday afternoon, his burial taking place about 6 O'clock in the evening. From this time until the same time on Saturday, we have three days and three nights. No one saw Jesus when he came from the tomb. It is my belief based upon all Bible references that it was at the end of the seventy-two hours mentioned above that Christ arose. When the Lord's followers came to the grave early the next morning they found it empty. This was the first day of the week. We will have more on this subject when we get to "The Christian Sabbath."

RECONCILING THE SCRIPTURES

I wish here to reconcile some of the scriptures related to the Lord's death, burial and resurrection. I have already given what Jesus taught concerning the three days and three nights. However, the question is often asked about the Sabbath that is mentioned elsewhere in the writings of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John on the subject.

We know there was the weekly Jewish Sabbath. There was an annual Sabbath observed by the Jews upon the 15th day of Nisan, a Lunar month, each year the lamb was to be killed in the evening of the 14th day of the month which was the preparation. Read this from Exodus 12:5-11. This annual

Sabbath could fall on any day of the week, as July 4, your birthday, or any other annual day. When Christ was crucified, this annual Jewish Sabbath fell on Thursday. Let's note, "The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the sabbath day. (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken. and that they might be taken away." John 19:31

So, this high day (annual sabbath) came on Thursday, the day after Christ's crucifixion. Friday was the second day and then Saturday, the weekly Sabbath, was the third day. The doctrine that Christ was crucified on Friday and arose on Sunday morning is just another false doctrine of Rome. Some argue that a portion of a day was called a whole. Not according to Jesus, John 11:9. Just for argument sake, let's say that Jesus was buried Friday and was raised Sunday morning. What do we have? We have two nights and one day! Just one-half the time Jesus said there would be. Do you believe Rome or Christ?

THE IMPORTANT FACTS

The important facts are that the powers of death, Satan and the world could not defeat God's plan and purpose. Christ died for the sins of the world and was buried, but the watchmen became as dead men when God's power was manifested at the tomb. Christ arose! He lives! The Lord said to John on Patmos, "I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death," Revelation 1:18.
