

Work, Radio Programs, etc. please send them to the BANNER for publication.

Decisions to publish, or not, any item submitted will be mine, and I will be responsible for all the contents (except typographical errors) of the BAPTIST BANNER.

Some information or articles printed may not have editorial endorsement but, in my opinion, will inform or benefit the general readership.

All articles, reports, and information (except for short announcements) should be typed and double spaced if possible. Please check for proper spelling and punctuation before sending any correspondence for publication. Any hand-written submission must be legible, preferably printed.

For publication in a given month, your correspondence should be in the BANNER mailbox by the 10th of the preceding month (example: publication date, month of May —information received by me by April 10th).

Any pictures sent for publication should be in black and white, if possible, as they will print better than color.

THOUGHTS TO LIVE BY

"So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it."

AN OLD MAN of the sea was observed by a young woman walking early one morning on the beach. He was picking up starfish and flinging them out to sea.

When she asked him "Why?" he said, "If left to the morning sun, the starfish will die."

"But," she said, "the beach is forever and there must be millions of starfish. How can you make any difference?" Holding one in his hand, he said, "It will make a difference to this one."

Sometimes we wonder what good we can do by trying to feed the few of the million of starving people in the world. The same thing could be said about introducing them to Christ. Individually we cannot do it all. Together we can do more. But whatever we do . . . just for one person it will make a difference. Isaiah 55:11 indicates when we act in faith, God does the rest. God's people are in the "people business!" As we remember we are only one, and sometimes one is all we may be able to reach — it will make a difference to that one eternally.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH SAVED MEN TODAY?

Our dear Jesus told us, "if any man will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." 1 Now if a man is following our Lord there's not much else you can ask of him. It is obvious though, not many of you are doing this. Look at the first thing required in following Jesus. Are you denying yourself? Your no answer is an admittance to selfishness and that's what's wrong with saved men today!

All of your goals, desires, and even needs take a back seat to God's and those of others when you deny yourself. Many of you follow your own path. You seek to satisfy your every desire and every pleasure. Your wife and children have become corrupted by your mis-directed leadership and may never know the depth of fellowship with Christ. You're not being accused of laziness. Most of you have worked and worked hard to achieve your goals. The problem is not that you end up with a desire or pleasure that is inherently bad. It's that you have invested so much time in something that is empty and contains no spiritual benefit.2 Worse yet you have forever lost the time you needed to fulfill your God-given responsibilities to others.

Selfishness! That's the problem. Didn't you hear Jesus say to you, "follow me." 3 He called you in the same way He called Peter and the only acceptable response is to forsake all and follow Him whom your soul loveth. As you approach your dear Lord you'll hear Him say, "Take my yoke upon you and learn of me." 5 Are you learning about the Holy One? You can read all about Him in the Scriptures or you can visit the land where He walked, but you've only scratched the surface until you walk side by side with Him. That's the real, first hand knowledge that runs deep and smooth.

As you walk with Jesus you will quickly discover that you are living for others. You will even deny yourself in order to serve others. You'll have to do that if you're going to walk with Jesus because that's the path He takes everytime. Look at home first in your search for others to serve. A saved man is responsible to God for his family's needs (physical, mental, and spiritual). You have denied the faith and you are unfit for other responsibilities if you neglect your family. The fifth and sixth chapters in the book of Ephesians will be a good place to review your responsibilities to your wife and children.

Turning to the fifth chapter you'll discover just how great a responsibility it is to take care of a wife. It will take a major portion of your time, but it's worth it. A saved man with an unhappy wife is greatly hindered in doing anything else. The Lord even says it is better to live in the wilderness, than with a quarreling and an angry woman. You probably already realize it is a big job keeping your wife happy. If she's unsaved it's even a bigger job. Nevertheless, it is your responsibility to do it. Fortunately, your Lord tells you how. It requires denying yourself and taking care of others, just like everything else when you follow Jesus. Notice the 25th verse in this chapter. You are to love your wife as Christ loves His church. Now Jesus sees to His church that she is nourished and He cherishes her as His loving bride. All of this happens because He puts her ahead of Himself in everything. Now that's how to keep a wife happy. Love her like you love yourself, even better. It's not a hard job because God steps in to help whenever you start. It does, however, take everyday dedication. You have to make the effort even on days when you're not in a good mood or she's not in one either. Remember, with a happy wife you'll have twice your strength to do everything else.

While your Bible is open to Ephesians, read the first four verses of chapter six. Here you find another of your family responsibilities your children. Notice the words "nurture" and "admonition." That means training and counseling. There's no getting around it, you're responsible to see to it that your children are raised in the Lord. You've heard of the man who spends more time training his dog than his children. Then he ties up the dog at night and lets his children run loose. Aren't children more important than dogs? In fact they are called God's heritage 8 and that means they belong to God. You're just training and counseling them for Him. As our Savior showed us, when it comes to training it's always best to train by example. You ought to be leading the way in home prayer, Bible study, worshiping God, honesty, truthfulness, moral purity, and all types of righteous living. The other part of raising children is counseling them. Two things are required to do this. First, you must know good counsel. You'll find that in the Holy Scriptures. Second, you must be able to talk to your children in a way they will listen and obey. If you lead by good example and show more concern for them than for yourself, they'll be anxious to honor you. With honoring comes obeying. The excuse, "the children today just won't listen to their parents," was first spoken by fathers who failed in their responsibility. Remember your guiding principle — "WITH GOD ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE." 9

Perhaps our Lord is convicting your heart of your errors and you are beginning to see the root of the problem is your selfishness. If this is the situation then Praise Be To God! I know He loves you and He won't give up on you. I'm sure He will continue to work in your life by continually applying His Word and by placing you in situations that will demand your reliance on Him. These two methods working together will bring about many needed changes in your conduct. Don't resist His working. Let Him have His way. Deny yourself and come follow Jesus.
