REPORT FROM JAPAN

Spring has come in the area we serve the Risen Saviour here in Japan, and flowers and blossoms are in full bloom. We send you our Christian greetings in His name remembering you and your people. We hope all of you well and have many blessings from the Lord.

I certainly missed the blessed fellowship with preachers and people at the Old Union Ministers School this year. I was home sick. At the time you were in Bowling Green, Ky., I took our Sunday School children up to one of the peaks of the mountains behind Hiroshima city one day to have singing and Bible study, where Lord blessed us greatly. It was a good time for us to look up the heavens and to look down the city from the mountain top, especially on the matter of missions to those blinded by gods of the world.

Many a time we get the invitation from the League of Hiroshima Christian Churches to join it and to take a part of its events and campaigns, to which we have never joined in any way. Recently we have got an invitation to join the Early Easter Morning Prayer Meeting with Catholics and Protestants, which was for the unity of both parties. The Ecumenical movement is more popular than it was before, especially after the Pope visited Japan and new completion of the New Testament translation into Japanese by both parties for the ecumenical purpose. They go together to hold services making offerings for the departed souls. This is nothing but by pagan idolatrious practice. We are missionary Baptists and not Protestants, and have no way to cooperate with them.

Right now we are studying doctrines on marriage and divorce, all what Bible says, which are great for us to dig deeper and deeper to find great lesson and practice divine. We also study on Scriptural funeral. I believe all these are important practices for the genuine believers to please the Saviour Jesus Christ in this confused pagan land.

Several days ago I received some books on Baptist and history from Bro. Raymond Callis of Nashville, Tenn. He also sent me a tape of a (Continued on Page 3)


