ANCIENT BIBLES ON DISPLAY

The Church History Research and Archives of Gallatin, Tenn. will presnt a most rare collection of Ancient Bibles and manuscripts at 7:00 nightly June 8, 9, 10, and 11 at Volunteer State Community College Auditorium, Hwy. 31E, Gallatin, Tennessee (Free Admission).

Elder Jewell E. Smith, long time pastor of Temple Baptist Church in Orlando, Florida will be presenting "YOUR BIBLICAL HERITAGE," a history of the English Bible. He will also be focusing on the present and antagonistic attack upon the Word of God. This collection of Bibles at one time belonged to the world's largest private collection and were displayed at the coronation of the present Queen of England.

The Bibles and manuscripts date as far back as 2040 B.C. (from Ur of Chaldees-Genesis 11) to the present. This magnificent collection of Bibles has been carefully planned and are brought together to inform an individual about the development of the English Bible. It also represents the crafts of the ancient scribe, artist, navigator, printer, and binder.

GOD WANTS OUR ATTENTION

"And Moses said, I will now turn aside, and see this great sight, why the bush is not burnt. And when the Lord saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto Him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses. And he said, Here am I." Exodus 3:3,4.

Moses was busy attending his father-in-law's flocks, and he seemed to be content with his occupation; but God had other plans for him, and He showed him an unusual sight to get his attention. Perhaps if this bush had just been burning and had burned up it wouldn't have attracted Moses' attention in such a way. The fact that the bush wasn't being consumed is why he turned aside to see, and this is what God wanted, and when he turned aside to see is when the Lord spoke to him to let him know about the work He had for him. Moses was born and grew up in Egypt and was the adopted son of the king's daughter, and had known what the Lord wanted with him while he was still in Egypt, but his people didn't understand how that God by his hand would deliver them from their terrible bondage, Acts 7:25; they accused him of trying to be a judge and ruler over them; they also charged him of wanting to kill them like he had the Egyptian the day before. Exodus 2:11-15. Because of this and the fact that Pharaoh sought to slay him, Moses fled to the land of Midian where he joined himself to Jethro, who later became his father-in-law; he married Jethro's daughtr and became a shepherd for Jethro's flocks; and as he advanced toward the back side of the desert to the mount of God, Horeb, God halted Moses with the strange sight, and it was here that the Lord reminded him that he must go back to Egypt.

Maybe Moses had been discouraged about what had happened to him in Egypt, he wanted to be used of God and deliver His people from their bondage, but the people wouldn't listen, and his life was in jeopardy. So in the land of Midian he seemed to find a good life, married to Jethro's daughter, and there were born to them two sons; he had employment, and I would guess a good livelihood. So he contented himself to dwell with his father-in-law in the land of Midian,

Exodus 2:21. But God had a way of calling his attention away from his present occupation to the work that He had raised him up for.

GOD HAS A WAY OF GETTING OUR ATTENTION

It seems to me that God is trying to get the attention of America today, but most people are too busy with the affairs of this life to take time out to listen. How much more does He have to send on this nation before we are going to give Him our attention? God has blessed this country with so much prosperity, more than any in the world, but these material goods have become the god of many, many people, even those who profess to be children of God. The God who gives can also take away, and He seems to be well on the way in doing just that. It appears that the judgement of God is being unleashed on our country, and every year that passes on us with violent force; and all kinds of tragedies are occurring, one after another. In all of this God must be trying to say something to us. I'm sure God would like to speak to us in a still small voice, like He did to Elijah, the prophet, 1 King 19:12, but when He can't get our attention by tenderly pleading, He can resort to judgement. If we study God's dealings with ancient Israel we can understand this. For centuries the Lord pled with His people to persuade them to turn back to Him, but they were stubborn and refused to listen, and then He would send a curse upon them. God said to His ancient people through His prophet, "Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord; though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." You see, God was trying to reason with them, He didn't necessarily want to send a curse upon them, He wanted them to come and have their sins cleansed and become obedient to Him. But He did warn them of what would happen if they didn't; as He said further, "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land; But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword; for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." Isaiah 1:18-20.

There must be people in the United States, and in other countries too, that think they can hide under a nuclear umbrella, but there is a force that is far stronger than nuclear energy; and He, Almighty God, can destroy what men have tried to build up, and He has His own method of doing so. Men would like to just go their own way and do things their own way, and leave God out. People are saying by their actions that they don't want God to rule their lives; but God will have the last word. "Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." Galatians 6:7.

GOD DESERVES OUR ATTENTION

"Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth; for I am God, and there is none else." Isaiah 45:22.

First of all God is saying, Look unto me, turn your attention to me and be saved, and then He said, I am God and beside me there is none else. Some religious people have many gods, but there is only one that deserves our love, our devotion and worship, for He alone can save us, keep us, and work for our good; and finally deliver us to eternal glory and bliss.

The religious people of Jesus's day, whom He called hypocrites, wanted the attention of the public and be honored for their giving and their praying; they would sound a trumpet to call the attention of the people when they would give their alms, stand on the corners of the street and pray to be seen of men. (Matthew 5:1-5) According to what Jesus said, we will have no reward of our Father in heaven if we do things to be seen of men. We must strive to attract the minds of the people to God and not to ourselves; for He doeth the works, and we are just little instruments in His mighty hand.

Men sometimes get carried away with what they see, even the mighty works of God, but fail to return to Him their heart's attention, and fail to give Him honor for His works; like the lepers whom Jesus cleansed, all ten of them received the cleansing but just one of them turned back to give glory to God. The one returned to Jesus, "With a loud voice glorified God." See Luke 17:12-18. The other nine went on their way enjoying what the Lord had done for them, but they failed to look back to Him from whom their blessing came. This seems to be the trend in our times, we are enjoying the good things of God, but how much love and gratitude is there being expressed to our heavenly Father? God is creator, and we are His creatures; He is Master, and we are servants; He is the Potter and we are the clay, and He is trying to shape us: God is Almighty, all wise, gracious and merciful, and why doesn't He deserve all that we can give Him. Maybe we don't have much to give, but we can give Him what we have; our life; our talents; our love and devotions. Like the leper mentioned above, "And he fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks." He wanted Jesus to know how much he appreciated what He had done for him, and he expressed his feelings in a very humble way.


