

OLD PATHS MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH


# Baptist Banner Policy



You will find enclosed a check to renew my subscription to the Baptist Banner for three more years. I enjoy the Banner and look forward to receiveing it each month.


It is hard to find old Baptists in a city like Houston.

ARTICLE 3. All instructors shall be


chosen by a unanimous vote of the school committee, and subject for approval by the
