

service, an old lady, named Kazuko Nakamura, came to me asking if I could visit her house. I answered her surely I would. She is from Matsuyama, Shikoku, a big island, away from Hiroshima port for three hours and half by ferryboat. All of her family moved to Hiroshima several months ago. One day by chance I spoke to her on the street. Then she began to come to church. She made it a secret to attend a group of Christian religion and hear the doctrines of it to anyone, especially to her family, to avoid any trouble. She is a Buddhist by birth and was brought up in it's surroundings. Where she was before is famous for it's Buddhist tradition. We can see chanting pilgrim go to 48 temples to complete their job in order to be saved all over shikoku.

The teaching of Christ is utterly new to her. Salvation by grace through faith, not by works. It was too simple for her to accept. But by hearing, under the leadership of Holy Spirit, she came to understand salvation of Christ. She is under conviction now. What she said was that she wanted me come to her house and talk to her family and witness Christ to them. Something happening. We would like for you pray for her and for them that they get saved and have eternal life.

I will leave Hiroshima after Wednesday Bible Class and prayer meeting for Yamaguchi and stay there the rest of the week, to fix something on church house, to hold two services at private houses at night, and a meeting at Kichinan Hospital Hall, and one at Yamaguchi church. I will pay some visit while I am there, and then come home late Saturday night. We will get more busier in the Lord's work as weather gets better. We would like for you to pray for us.




