

BLIND LEADERS

"...they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch." Matthew 15:14

In this modern age of progress, we have employed our minds to the task of building nations, schools, industries, homes, etc., but little is mentioned concerning the true converts and the construction of true churches. Our nation is the most religious nation in the world. Notice the word "religious" and not "righteous" was used in the previous statement. What's the difference? A "religious" person is one who adheres fervently, devoutly, and zealously to whatever beliefs he may have toward man's relationship with God. The "religionist" may be deceived in his own heart. James 1:26. Now, the "righteous" and not the self-righteous man is the individual who has been saved by the glorious grace of God. Jesus said, "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." Luke 5:32

My primary objective in this article is to question the authenticity of pulpit leaders. The first and foremost qualification of any soulwinner must of necessity require that this person have a knowledge of being born again by the Divine Spirit of God. Can any one say, innocently, "it makes no difference for I believe so-and-so is a good person." These folks about whom the text was written were the strictest self-righteous people, but their hearts were far from the innocence of sin. Yes, my good readers, it made a difference with Christ and it should be with us that we settle for nothing less than he commands and requires. A blind leader (unsaved person) knows nothing about the indwelling Spirit of God, does not possess a divine call to preach the gospel, and neither will he have any power in the administration of the word. The trend of the day in many Baptist Churches is a plea by the members to denounce no one's doctrine, but preach Jesus. Then one of the members joins a false, heretical church, and none are disturbed nor alarmed by this breach of fellowship. If the pastor condemns such permissiveness, the church is so weak they vell. "we need another pastor." There's your community church. A little bit of everything and not much of anything. You show me a man who preaches Christ in His fulness, and I'll show you a man who publicly condemns and denounces false doctrines and blind leaders amidst his delivering all the counsel of God. We can not affirm the precepts without denying the abstracts. To generalize is to neutralize, and, therefore remove the "savour of life unto life and the savour of death unto death." Then, there's the group who says, "we don't want to hurt anyone's feelings." Well, if you ask me, the only ones I count as real friends are those who will tell me the truth, regardless of the hurt. Would it be better to never expose a person's pretentious position, and let him die in sin and dwell with the wicked in eternity? God forbid!

I was once asked this question; "Do you Baptists receive a Methodist who has only been sprinkled?" My answer and still is, "that we don't care if they've been baptized, the only way we'll receive one is on their profession of faith in Christ and then we baptize them. Why would you do that? Because they are decendents of their religious father, John Wesley, who acknowledged being a sinner at the time he came from England to the United & ates and formed "Methodism" in Dalton, Georgia. See what I mean by "blind leaders"! Will you contribute to the furtherance of such spiritual adultery?

Now, here comes another man who asks, "is it not possible for a person to hear the gospel from a Methodist and thus become a child of God?" Yes, every time a soul is saved it is over the power of Satan and all his forces. God will bless the truth! Paul said, "some preach Christ even of envy and strife, another of contention. What then? Notwithstanding, every way, whether in pretence, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice." Phip. 1:18.

One Christ came to build one church which should have one Lord, one faith, and one baptism. You trace the historical chronology of every religious sect in the world, and after exhausting all your efforts, you will be left with the one Christ built. That church can be indentified by her doctrinal teachings today, as a true Baptist Church.
