2. DRUNKENNESS LEADS TO POV-ERTY AND RAGS.



No Political Appointments

It is a well-recognized American principle that one's freedom stops when it begins to interfere with the freedom of his fellows. We all believe in free speech and in one's right to express his feelings and be liefs, but the Supreme Court has gone much too far in interpreting this principle to mean that a Communist has a right to teach atheism and the destruction of our form of government by force or violence to our children and at our expense.

To say that the people are powerless to stop him from doing so is to destroy our freedom, and as one of the dissenting Justices said, "To deprive us of the right of selfpreservation." To compel parents to pay a Communist to teach their children that the most important things Americans believe -- the existence of a sovereign, Supreme Being; self-government; and the right to be free--are all wrong and that these very concepts should be destroyed, is re pugnant to American ideology, rank injustice and the worst form of tyranny.

To tell our school authorities that they cannot discharge a Communist teacher, or that one who is subversive and teaches sedition, cannot be prevented from conveying such ideas to our children, and at the same time we must pay him for

doing so, is to deprive the American people of one of their most precious freedoms. The freedom to bring up one's children in accordance with one's religious, economic and political beliefs is a sacred principle of American life that has now been struck down by the Supreme Court.

The Court holds in its hands the fate of the American people. Only men of the very highest integrity should be entrusted with that responsibility. Let there be no more political appointments.

hath bubbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes? They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine."-Prov. 23:29, 30

4. WINE AT FIRST PLEASING, IN THE END IS AS POISONOUS AS A RATTLESNAKE.

"Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his color in the cup, when it moveth itself aright. At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder."

5. LIQUOR INFLAMES LUST, DEADENS JUDGMENT, AND EN-SLAVES THE WILL.

"Thine eyes shall behold strange women, and thine heart shall utter perverse things. Yea, thou shalt be as he that lieth down in the midst of the sea, or as he that lieth upon the top of a mast. They and I was not sick; they have beaten me, and I felt it not; when shall I again awake? I will seek it yet again." --Prov. 23:33-35.

6. THE DRUNKARD IS DANGER-OUS TO HIMSELF AS WELL AS TO OTHERS.

"As a thorn goeth up onto the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools."-Prov. 26:9.

7. LIQUOR CORRUPTS COURTS AND GOVERNMENT, BRINGING NATIONAL DESTRUCTION.

"It is not for Kings, O Lemuel, it is not for kings to drink wine; nor for princes strong drink; Lest they drink, and forget the law; and pervert the judgment of any of the afflicted."-Prov. 31:4, 5.

"Woe unto them that are mighty to drink wine, and men of strength to mingle strong drink: Which justify the wicked for reward, and take away the righteousness of the rightous from him! Therefore, as the fire devoureth the stubble, and the flame consumeth the chaff, so their root shall be as rottenness, and their blossom shall go up as dust: because they have cast away the law of the Lord of hosts, and despised the word of the Holy one of Israel." -Isa. 5:22-24.

7. LIQUOR MAKES MEN FORGET GOD.

"Woe unto them that rise up early in the morning, that they may follow strong drink; that continue until night, till wine inflame them! And the harp, and the viol, the tabret, and pipe, and wine, are in their feasts: but they regard not the work of the Lord, neither consider the operation of his hands.--Isa. 5:11, 12.

9. THE CURSE OF GOD IS ON THE DRUNKARD.

"Woe to the crown of pride, to the drunkards of Ephraim, whose glorious beauty is a fading flower, which are on the head of the fat valleys of them that are overcome with wine! Behold, the Lord hath a mighty and strong one, which as a tempest of hail and a destroying storm, as a flood of mighty waters overflowing, shall cast down to the earth with the drunkards of Ephraim, shall be trodden under feet."--Isa. 28:1-3"

10. THE CURSE OF GOD IS ON EVERY MAN, EVERY BUSINESS, EVERY GOVERNMENT THAT GIVES OR SELLS BOOZE.

"Woe unto him that giveth his neighbor drink, that puttest thy bottle to him, and makest him drunken also, that thou mayest look on their nakedness! Thou art filled with shame for glory: drink thou also, and let thy foreskin be uncovered: the cup of the Lord's right hand shall be turned unto thee, and shameful spewing shall be on thy glory."--Hab. 2:15-16.

11. MODERATE DRINKING LEADS TO DRUNKENNESS, NAKEDNESS, AND A CURSE ON THE DRUNK-ARD'S CHILDREN.

"And Noah began to be an husbandman, and he planted a wineyard: And he drank of the wine, and was drunken; and he was uncovered within his tent. And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brethren without. And Shem and Japheth took a garment, and laid it upon their shoulders, and went backward and covered the nakedness of their father; and their faces were backward, and they saw not their father's nakedness. And Noah awoke from his wine, and knew what his younger son had done unto him. And he said, Cursed be Canaan: a servant of servants shall he be unto his brethren."-Gen. 9:20-25.

12. DRUNKENNESS LEADS TO A-DULTERY, INCEST, AND ILLEG-ITIMATE CHILDREN.

"And Lot went up out of Zoar, and dwelt in the mountains, and his two daughters with him; for he feared to dwell in Zoar; and he dwelt in a cave, he and his two daughters. And the firstborn said unto the younger, Our father is old and there is not a man in the earth to come in unto us after the manner of all the earth: Come, let us make our father drink wine, and we will lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. And they made their father drink wine that night: and the firstborn went in, and lay with her father; and he perceived not when she lie down, nor when she arose. And it came to pass on the morrow, that the first born said unto the younger, Behold, I lay yesternight with my father: Let us make him drink in, and lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. And they made their father drink wine that night also: and the younger arose, and lay with him; and he perceived not when she lay down, nor when she arose. Thus, were both the daughters of Lot with child by their father.' '-Gen. 19:30-36.

13. CHRISTIANS NOT TO ASSO-CI ATE WITH DRUNKARDS.

"But now I have written unto you not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat."-I Cor. 5:11.

14. DRUNKENNESS KEEPS PEO-PLE OUT OF HEAVEN.

"Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, Nor thieves, nor covetous, NOR DRUNK-ARDS, Nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God."--I Cor. 6:9, 10.

15. JES US CHRIS T SAVES DRUNK-ARDS.

"And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God."--I Cor. 6:11.

"Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord; Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool."-Isa. 1:18.

IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT WINE IN THE BIBLE

Wine in the Bible, refers to grape juice, whether fermented or unfermented. There is no other word, either in the Hebrew of the Old Testament or in the Greek of the New Testament, to designate grape juice than, those for wine. Grape juice is called wine as soon as it comes out of the press .-- Prov. 3:10.

As a result, the word wine in to intoxicating liquor. It certainly was not intoxicating wine that Jesus made as recorded in John the second chapter when he turned the water into wine at the wedding in Cana.

It was not intoxicating wine that Paul recommended to Timothy for his weak stomach (I Tim. 5:23) but simply grape juice which doctors now sometimes prescribe for the same purpose.

The Bible does not indicate that intoxicating wine was used for the Lord's Supper. It is never called wine in the Bible in this connection, however, but "the fruit of the vine" (Matt. 25:29) or "the cup."

The Bible does not contradict itself. If "wine is a mocker and strong drink is raging" in one part of the Bible, you may be sure that God does not recommend that same kind of wine in another part of the Bible.

See that drinking people have a chance to read these verses from the Word of God which show the awful results of liquor.
