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Catholic Prelates Clash On Documents

VATICAN CITY — The synod of bishops, called to give Pope Paul VI the opinions of prelates on Roman Catholic Church problems, went into its second week with a clash between liberals and Conservatives in the limelight.

The synod of nearly 200 cardinals, archishops, and bishops resumed debate on a document on "dangerous errors" of Catholic thinking. The debate has highlighted differences between progressives and traditionalists in the church.
