Old Historic Church Remodeled



Old Union Baptist Church, Bowling Green, Ky.

Old Union Baptist Church in Warren County, Ky., located south of Bowling Green on Highway 240, has remodeled its house of worship. During this year, 1968, the remodeling has included building additional Sunday School rooms, a new roof, steeple, concrete walks, steps, landscaping, refinishing the interior, bricking the entire structure and central air-condition. Elder W. T. Russell was the contractor and supervisor.

The church closed a revival in November with two profession of faith and two additions to the church. Another revival closed the first Sunday in August with ten professions of faith and eleven additions to the church.

Old Union church was organized in 1795. The first house of worship was a log building which was shared with other denominations. In the last century a brick building was erected and used for some time. But for some reason it was replaced with a frame structure in 1866, and it has been kept in a good state of re-

pair until the present remodeling. A picture of the church made about fifty years ago, 1918, is on page 3.

A history of this church, 1795-1966, can be purchased by sending \$1.00 to the editor of the BANNER.

Elder H. C. Vanderpool is pastor of this church and has served since Nov. 17, 1951 except 1961-1962. On Jan. 1, he will begin his sixteenth pastoral year.

Since 1951 there have been 194 additions by letter and 192 by baptism - a total of 386. The church has granted letters during this period for the organization of two other Baptist churches; Grace Baptist Church, Detroit Michigan, organized in 1955, and Calvary Baptist Church, Carthage, Tennessee, organized in 1967.

The church has full-time services on Sunday and Sunday night, and Wednesday nights. It supports Home and For-

Moral Standards The Basis of Law

LAW REPRESENTS THE EFFORTS of men to codify moral standards and to fix penalties for those who will not observe them. Moral standards preceded law. They came from man's concept of the ethical ideals which he derives from God. When men cease to believe in God, there are no such ideals. Hence, there are no moral standards to be translated into law.

We are forced to conclude that men who do not believe in God have few, if any, moral ideals upon which to erect a moral law. That's why when faith in God disappears, moral standards crumble. Laws against crime are ignored or repealed. The new idea is that men do not sin and do wrong; they are ill, uninformed, their diet has been inadequate, their training insufficient, or the standards themselves are not valid.

This leads us once more to observe that freedom, free government and economic well-being are possible only for men whose faith in God leads them to accept moral standards which, in turn, impose upon them the necessity to tell the truth, to be honest, fair, generous and kind in their dealings with their fellows. If they believe such ideals come from God, they will observe them. If they have no God, they have no ideals and the only important thing to them is to get what they



want. This they will then seek to do anywhere, any time and in anyway they can. We are told that it is not sin, it is not violation of moral standards, for without God there are no such concepts.

When men arrive at this state, the strong exploit, the weak and tyranny is inevitable. In place of voluntary discipline, which men accept as a concomitant of their belief in God, we have only the discipline imposed upon them by the secret police who owe allegiance only to the dictator. Men who do not believe in God turn to the state as the only other means of establishing discipline. Instead of the voluntary discipline which one imposes upon himself because he believes it is the will of God, we then have only the cruel discipline enforced by the Totalitarian State.

Careful reasoning, therefore, leads us to the conclusion that the decline of the West arises straight out of its loss of faith in God. Men become interested in crime, sexual abuses, in power, aggrandizement, riches and fame in inverse proportion as they lose their faith in God and the moral ideals which He has ordained. There is no hope for the West if it does not recover its faith in God. Without Him, our destiny will be atheistic, humanistic Communism. --- Christian Economics
