City's Schools Adopt Prayer, Bible Reading

Clairton, Pa. (RNS) - This city's 3,200 public school students reportedly have expressed themselves as being "almost unanimously" in favor of a new "course" that has been added to the curriculum.

The course is called "Bible reading and prayer" and it was returned to classrooms in defiance of the five-year-old ban by the U.S. Supreme Court.

But Clairton is, as one observer put it "not only in the Bible belt of the state, but it has the buckle on, too." So far, not one protest has been heard in this community deep in the heart of the Monongahela Valley.

Clairton's nine-member school board ordered revival of the Bible reading and prayer ceremonies. School Supt. Robert LaFrankie then sought legal opinions from county and state authorities.

Residents Were Impatient

Impatient at inaction, residents bombarded the school office with calls urging compliance with the school board's order.

The superintendent called a staff meeting and then announced a decision "to start the program immediately. . .and take our chances. The worst that can happen is an injunction."

With Me Through Bible Lands," which will have approximately sixteen chapters 110-120 pages and between forty and fifty photographs. I trust I can get this to the publishers in the next few weeks and have it for distribution a few months from now. Information about the book and the way to obtain it will be made in the BANNER. So, the full report my tour of the Holy Land and other countries of the Bible will be published in the book and the reports in the BANNER will be brief due to space.

I must say that my experience of traveling through the Bible Lands was a very enjoyable and inspirational one. I met some of the best people in the world on our tour. There were ten states and two foreign countries represented in our tour group.

On our first day — March 3 — we met at the T. W. A. Conference room at Kennedy International Airport in New York. After getting acquainted with one another and being briefed by our directors, Dr. and Mrs. E. M. Harrison, we had prayer and went to board our plane. It was a Boeing 707. We left New York at 9:55 P. M. (E. S. T.) on flight 840 for Athens, Greece. We stopped briefly at Rome. We flew at approximately 600

mi. per hr. and at an altitude of between 31,000 and 36,000 ft.

We flew over Paris. As we were flying over Switzerland we could see the snow-capped peaks of the Alps Mountains. We arrived at Athens on Tuesday, March 4 at 5:45 p.m. Athens time. It was raining and the temperature stood at 50°. From the airport we were taken by bus to Electra Hotel for the night.

An unfortunate thing happened here. Bro. Harrison became very ill and had to be admitted to a hospital the next morning. He and Sister Harrison didn't get to continue with us on the tour. But we were so thankful that the Lord blessed him and he was able to come home at the end of the tour. Of course some of our group went on an extended tour of other countries which lasted another week.

The next day, Wednesday, March 5, we went to Corinth which is sixty miles west of Athens.

We say the beautiful Canal of Corninth as weathere entering the general area of the city. We went to the site of the old Corinth where we saw the ruins of the Temple of Apollo, The Asclepeion of Ancient Corinth, The Altar in the Agora, The Fountain of Peirene, the ruins of the

old Corinthian shops and walked along the old Lechaeon Road.

We stood on the place where the Apostle Paul stood when brought before Gallio for preaching the gospel of Christ. (Acts 18:12-16)

Under the Romans, Athens was still the educational center of Greece, but Corinth was the capital of the Roman province called by them Achaia. (Acts 19: 21; II Cor. 9:2)

On the road from Athens to Corinth we had seen the Nomads living in their huts and tents as their forefathers had 3000 years ago.

Near Corinth we entered a large orange grove and were permitted to gather the delicious fruit. The oranges were very tasteful. At noon we returned to Athens.
