A. Neg. Separation from evil.

I Thess, 4:3-7. For this is the will of God, even your santification, that ye should abstain from fornication: That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor. Not in the lust of concupiscence, even as the Gentiles which know not God: That no man go beyond and defraud his brother in any matter: because that the Lord is the avenger of all such, as we also have forewarned you and testified. For God hath not called us unto uncleanness but unto holiness. So Paul is teaching these Christians that if. they expect to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord, that it's only by obedience.

B. Pos. Dedication to God.

John 10:36. Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God? Anything that is set aside for sacred use. If we as members of the one true Church expect to grow and prosper in spiritual things

## Missionary Reports From Mexico

Guadalajara, Jalisco April 3, 1970

Dear friends and brethern,

God has continued to bless us with good health for which we are thankful. In this city of one and a half million people there is little or no sewage treatment. We are constantly exposed to filth and disease. We have to constantly be on guard against amebas, hepatitis and other semitropical diseases. During the last three months we have been bothered by amebic dysentery, flu and several other minor infections.

We are now two thirds finished with the language course that we're taking. Also, after much prayer and having visited several towns and villages, we feel that we know where the Lord would have us begin a permanent work. We are making plans to set up a permanent place of residence and begin work on a full time basis.

Another thing that has caused us more than a little concern is the question of alien immersion and fellowship of the same. My home church, namely Caney Fork, is under charge by Enon Association concerning the matter. We haven't yet received a copy of the associational minutes nor have we had any correspondence from the church as to what course they intend to pursue concerning the charge. We have, however, had several letters of varying reports from various individuals about the matter. As we haven't been ordained yet, we are here as an Evangelist; therefore, we beg that you continue to pray and bear with us until a definate solution is reached. We realize that this is a "serious" situation that demands that we look to God and his word for the solution.

We are planning to be in the states in August for a short visit at which time we hope to have made plans concerning our future course. we need more-dedicated preachers and teachers. Man looks on the outward appearance, but God looks on the hearts: So let's show the world by works, what we received by Grace through faith, as the scripture says, "Love not in word, but in deed and truth."

C. Used of the Devine Nature.

Ezek. 36:24-25. For I will take you' from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land. Then will sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols, will I cleanse you. And in the 32nd verse God says, "Not for your sakes do I this, saith the Lord God, be it known unto you: be ashamed and confounded for your own ways, O house of Israel." And James says, "Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures." When Israel rejected the gift of God, He turned to the Gentiles. if we being true Missionary Baptists were more dedicated to the cause as a bride ought to be, we would see more souls saved, and more Christians added to the Church. Thus being used in a devine way. II. When it takes place.

A. Instantly:

I Cor. 6:11. "And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the spirit of our God. The very moment a person believes in Christ to the extent he is saved, he is sanctified, that is, in the

first sense. Read Heb. 10 & 14 and I Cor. 1:2.

B. Progressive:

Regeneration has to do with our nature, justification with our standing, then sanctification has to do with our character and conduct. Justification is what God does for us, sanctification is what God does in us. Justification is instant without progression, while sanctification is instant and also progressive. II Pet. 3:18; II Cor. 3:18; I Thess. 3:12; 4:1 & 10; II Cor. 7:1; Eph. 4:11-15; Phil. 3:10-15.

C. Complete Santification:

The blessing of being wholly sanctified will take place when Christ returns, I Thess. 5:23, I Thess. 3:13. Yes it's when Christ comes that we shall be like Him. I John 3:2. And Paul writes it so plain in Phil 3:12-14, Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus. Brethern, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

May we as the Bride of Christ forget those things which are behind, and press toward perfection, and announce from the housetops, "And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely. Amen.


#### MARRIED WISDOM
