Jerimiah 20:9. If the Word is like a fire burning in our own heart as preachers, more than likely it will set fire to those that we preach to.

It is not the most lengthy message that is always the most effective. In fact length can sometimes put a damper on what we preached up to the time we should have stopped; especially if we just go on repeating ourselves. I have heard good sermons spoiled by repetition, get lifted up and then let down. A preacher should know when to stop as well as when to start; and I believe all of us who have been in the ministry very long realize what I am saying. We are always learning something. We don't get too old to learn; and some things that we observe along the way is a very good teacher.

ALCOHOL FACTS

- •Latest surveys reveal that 110 million Americans (age 15 and above) consume alcoholic beverages. This is 71% of that segment of the population.
- •Drinking alcoholic beverages is the third leading cause of death in the United States, right behind heart disease and cancer; though, ironically, alcohol can cause both these diseases.
- •There are now over 11 million alcoholics in the United States, and we are producing new alcoholics at the rate of about 1200 per day. Tennessee has at least 200,000 alcoholics.
- Drinking driving is the no. 1 killer of young people today. Suicide is second.
- •The National Institute on Alcohol and Alcoholism estimates there are 3.3 million problem drinkers among youth in the 14 to 17 age range. (About 1 in every
- •The proportion of high school students who reported ever having been drunk increased from 19% in 1966 to 45% in 1978. The proportion of high school students being intoxicated at least once a month rose from 10% in 1966 to 19% in 1978.
- •The cost of alcohol problems in American society has now risen to a record \$61 billion in 1979, according to the American Business Men's Research Foundation. Largest economic cost (\$28

billion) is in the area of lost production of goods and services. \$18.2 billion was spent in the area of health care on alcohol-related illnesses in 1979.

- •The cost of alcohol problems is at least \$4.41 for every \$1.00 collected in total tax revenues from beer, wine and whiskey.
- •In the United States during the decade of the 1970's wine sales increased 66%; beer sales increased 38%; and distilled spirits increased by 23%.
- •Average per capita consumption in Tennessee (15 years and older): Beer....25 gallons per person Whiskey and Wine....21/2 gallons per person

PRESSURES OF THE TIMES

In all the hustle and bustle of the times, and the pressures of life, makes it harder for a minister to get his mind on his study and meditation, so that he can have a message on his heart at all times for his people, and for the glory of Him who has called us. The very first qualification for the minister given by Paul, to both Timothy and Titus is: "A Bishop must be blameless." I Timothy 3:2; Titus 1:7. And I fully believe that all who hear us preach are truly expecting us to be just that.

WHAT DO YOU LOOK FOR IN A PREACHER?

Is it the preachers beaming personality, his ability to socialize, his sense of humor to keep all the young people in high spirits and doing their own thing? Or is it the man's preaching that you are primarily interested in? What is a preacher supposed to do anyway? There are some things a preacher can do, and should do in addition to his preaching from the pulpit; but his highest and most noble duty and responsibility is to give himself to prayer and the ministering of the Word of God. See Acts 6:1-4. God's preacher should be social in his relationship with people, Jesus was. He mixed with the multitudes, He went in and ate with them at their feasts; but He did it to win the people to Himself, and not to entertain them, or to be entertained. And I am quite sure that our Lord approached the people with a pleasing personality, He wasn't a grouch. As to His sense of humor????, Maybe you might be able to bring me up to date on that. I am rather sure that He wasn't like the Chaplain of Bourbon Street, wasting a lot of precious time telling Jokes. Certainly a preacher can go too far with his jokes, especially the dirty ones, and injure his ministry.

NO SUBSTITUTE FOR THE WORD OF GOD

I have known a few people that you could preach any subject from the Bible to, and they would love it; and there are people still that love to be fed on the Word of God, any subject, just so it is from the Bible. But there are those who had rather just hear what will make them feel good at the present, something juicy. They had rather not hear anything that would reprove them of their sins, or anything of a doctrinal nature. God has given us a system of teaching in His Scriptures that would mold and fit His people for just what He wants of them; but this teaching has to be taught, heard, and applied in order for it to accomplish the end which He has in it for us. Jesus prayed for His disciples thus: "Sanctify them through Thy Truth; Thy Word is Truth." John 17:17. Sanctify means to set apart. God's people need to be set apart, they must be different, and it takes God's truth to set them apart, to make them different from the people of the world. If something is wrong in the life of one of God's children and the preacher doesn't declare from the Word of God that it is wrong, then of course the person will go right on doing the same thing, thinking that there is nothing wrong in it.
