THE MARK OF TRUE REPENTANCE

A penitent heart in consideration of wrong done is one of God's conditions in order to obtain forgiveness of sins. As they who have experienced repentance unto the forgiveness of sins well know, that depth of repentance is not easily reached, and when experienced it leaves one in a changed state not to be easily led back into the sinful living just repented of. There is in this day we live a lot of repentance being claimed which is manifest to be far too shallow for the wise in heart to accept as genuine. Yet he who doubts the penitence of the wrong doer is assailed by many who declare that he has no right to such doubts about his fellow man. It is needful to realize that true penitence, the kind God honors, is accompanied by such a loathing of self because of sin that the penitent soul dares not think that he deserves anything but a just punishment for his wrongdoing.

The king of Nineveh in commanding penitence and prayer unto his people added, "Who can tell if God will turn and repent, and turn away from his fierce anger, that we perish not"? The uncertainty expressed by the king is indicative of a desperate fear in pleading for the mercy of one who ought to deal out justice, but for his goodness and the genuine penitence of the condemned, but who forgives instead.

Righteous Job, who had none other like him in the earth according to God's own testimony, when at last he saw the relative greatness of his master when compared to himself, replied "I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes." He had so little to repent of, we (who put ourselves in little danger of the subtle sin of self-righteousness) would suppose, and yet he uttered "I abhor myself" as he repented of his sin.

The wayward son who wasted his inheritance with riotous living was returning, desperately hungry and determined

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able to stand against the wiles of the devil", Ephesians 6:11. Having put on the whole armour of God as admonished by Paul, the text gives the best advice for a successful defense, NEITHER GIVE PLACE TO THE DEVIL. Do not give him a starting point in your life. We will now consider some points regarding this principle.

I. THE DEVIL STRIVES TO GAIN THE MASTERY OVER MAN. He is not timid, bashful, easily insulted, and will come into personal contact with us even against our will. At first glance he may be difficult to recognize as he is a "wolf in sheep's clothing". Satan does not usually present himself as a "saloon-keeper" or "ruffian" type as one might suppose. He is a great pretender who has transformed himself into an angel of light. "An no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light", II Corinthians 11:14. Not only is he often undetectable as he is very pleasant to the eye, but he is an intelligent and discerning creature.

He will study our personality as the botanist explores the flower through the microscope. He might also be likened to the military commander who enters new territory. "He will usually spread a map upon the ground, and upon his knees he ponders it until he is familiar with ALL it's features; he becomes acquainted with the rivers, with their bridges and fords, the villages and their position in relation to adjacent towns. He then plans his method of attack". So it is with our spiritual enemy. Our spiritual adversary has his plan and strategy. He watches his victim, acquaints himself with his words. demeanor (especially temper), actions, the company we keep, our pleasures and recreations and especially our habits. He then constructs his assault accordingly. The devil sternly resolves to conquer and we find such evidence in his confrontations with both Eve (Genesis 3:1-6), and Job (Job 1:, 2:).

II. MAN IS TO SUCCESSFULLY RESISTTHE DEVIL. Even though he is a real being and powerful he is a defeated foe through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. The Bible also teaches that God will not allow us to be tempted above that we are able to stand. "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it, I Corinthians 10:13.

If we aren't careful we may GIVE PLACE TO THE DEVIL by:

- 1. Allowing our hearts to become empty of good things. The heart that is not filled with good thoughts and desires is left empty for the enemy to enter.
- 2. Becoming too insensitive to the spiritual world around us. We may fall under the influence of the great adversary by yielding to spiritual indolence (laziness). Industry and watchfulness distinguish all real Christians. As soon as they become indolent they cease to be on their guard against the enemy of souls.
- 3. The Christian may provide favourable opportunity to Satan by their attention being absorbed into worldly business. Surely this age is characterized by "worldliness" and "materialish".

We must be steadfast in our resistance of Satan because one sin makes room for more. One sin keeps up the devil's interest. It is like a "nest egg" left there to draw a new temptation. By allowing one sin we tend to disarm ourselves against standing against the next encounter with sin. We should be steadfast because we may be sure that the devil never means good, but always evil. The more we yield to the influence of Satan, the further he will press his authority, and the more complete will be his dominion over us.

Finally there is no substitute for persistence and steadfastness against Satan because actually the child of God is never obligated to yield to him. He can only conquer if we allow him too. We must resist the very beginning of temptation; we can't give any quarter to Satan. Give him an inch and he will take a mile; give him a corner and he will take the house, and give him an opening and he will fill the tent. Watch and pray steadfastly that you enter not into temptation.

III. HOW TO RESIST THE DEVIL.

- 1. The first step is directed to the unbeliever. Sinner friend you must first be saved before you can successfully resist the devil. You must first have your heart washed free of sin by the blood of Jesus Christ. When we get saved we have God's Spirit living within us. "Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them; because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world", I John 4:4. When you are saved then you can have the same promise which Jesus Christ gave to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness".
- 2. Having been saved by repentance toward God and faith toward the Lord Jesus Christ, our lives must be filled with repentance for our continual sins of the

flesh. We must be cleansed of our sins in our lives. "For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day", II Corinthians 4:16. "And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness", Ephesians 4:23-24. We must pray and repent daily. Unconfessed sin is a place for the devil.

- 3. We must concentrate on the need to overcome Satan. "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:", I Peter 5:8. We must at all times be spiritually alert to the wiles of Satan.
- 4. We must continually resist the devil. We never reach the place in this life that we can afford to let down our guard. "Whom resist steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world", I Peter 5:9.

In summary we may say that Satan is a defeated foe, but one that must be regarded as an imminent threat every moment of our lives. Jesus Christ defeated him in the world, in his life, and finally in his death and resurrection. "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you", James 4:7. Praise God we can do all things through Jesus Christ which strengthens us.

THE MARK OF TRUE REPENTANCE

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to beg for a place in his father's house as a hired servant that he might only obtain enough to live.

We can easily see that the true penitent dares only ask for what he MUST have; but God gives him much more than he asks for, full pardon, and blessings beside.

Far too much has been preached by comparison of the great-heartedness of God and of his people, and far too little has been taught of his, and their, severity. The result of this unbalance is a lot of people who behave before God and his saints like incredibly spoiled children. Again and again we observe modern day prodigals returning from their riotous activities. They come in and say "I'm sorry" with a chip on each shoulder which will immediately fall off if one brother expresses a sign of disbelief. They look around, this way and that, at those to whom they have done wrong and after a moment express their thoughts, "Hey! Where is my fatted calf?"
