THE REALITY OF HELL

Men often refer to those things that they can physically see, feel, hold, and possess as "real." "Real" things are fixed, permanent, immovable, or occuring in fact. "Real" things are not artificial, fraudulent, or illusory. Nothing is more real than hell.

The author will leave to the reader a detailed word study of "hell," but must mention that three New Testament Greek words are translated into the English word "hell." It is *Gehenna* (used 13 times in the New Testament, 12 of those by Christ) that refers to the place of retributive suffering. This word derives its meaning from the Hebrew, *ge-hinnon* (the valley of Hinnon) which was a refuse pit into which was dumped the filth of Jerusalem and the bodies of executed criminals to be burned. This putrid and continually burning trash pit yields faint image of a place "where their worm dieth not, and fire is not quenched."

Hell is real and does exist. It is a place. Man, a creation of God, is real and must be posited somewhere. At death the body of man returns to the earth from which it came, and the soul of man goes either to paradise with God or to hell. After resurrection and judgment, the wicked shall be cast body and soul into hell. Certainly Jesus Christ was referring to a real place in Matthew 10:28, "And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." When Christ said "in hell" that is exactly what he meant.

Hell is not just a place of happenstance, but is a prepared place. Matthew 25:41, "Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his

angels." The same omnipotence employed in making a city of habitation for those that love God was also used in preparing a place of torment for the devil and his angels, into which all the wicked of man shall be cast. The rack, thumb screws, and stakes of the dark ages in Europe remind us of the persecution and torment that men inflicted upon our forefathers in the faith. But, it is the omnipotence of God that will destroy without ceasing the soul and body of wicked man in hell. "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God," Hebrews 10:31.

Hell is a prison. II Peter 2:4, "... God spared not the angels that sinned, but cast them down to hell, and delivered them into

A Living Christ for a Dying World.

ELIJAH Prophet of Israel

Elijah, a Tishbite of Gilead, suddenly appears in I Kings 17. For the fourteen year period 910-896 B.C. Elijah left an indelible mark on religious history.

His first prophecy was offered in the presence of King Ahab as follows: "As the Lord God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word." He immediately hid himself at the command of the Lord. While hidden before Jordan by the Cherith brook, the ravens brought him bread and flesh twice a day.

The Lord directed him to Zarephath and a certain widow woman having one son. Elijah requested water and bread from the woman. Water she had, but only meal enough for perhaps two more cakes – one for her son and one for herself. The woman told the prophet her plans of preparing those two cakes, eating and dying. Elijah commanded her to make him a cake first and then for her and her son. He informed her that the meal nor cruse of oil would be depleted until rain came and that this would be accomplished by the Lord God of Israel. For many days following they all continued to eat from that barrel of meal and cruse of oil.

Then, the woman's son fell sick and in fact did stop breathing. He was dead! Elijah took the boy up into the loft of her house and stretched himself upon the boy three times and cried, "O Lord my God, I pray thee, let this child's soul come into him again. And the Lord heard the voice of Elijah; and the soul of the child came into him again, and he revived." I Kings 17:17-24

Perhaps the most memorable event in Elijah's life occurred at mount Carmel. Ahab had accused Elijah of troubling Israel. Elijah shot back at him these words, "I have not troubled Israel; but thou, and thy father's house, in that ye have forsaken the commandments of the Lord, and thou hast followed Baalim." Elijah challenged Ahab and his 450 prophets along with the 400 prophets of the groves that ate at Jezebel's table. Please read I Kings 18:21-40.

After God had proven Himself by consuming the sacrifice prepared by Elijah, he ran from Jezebel who threatened his life. Notice I Kings 19:1-18.

Elijah annointed Elisha to succeed him as prophet in Israel (I Kings 19:16-21).

Ahab was foretold of his death because of the evil committed toward Naboth. "In the place where dogs licked the blood of Naboth shall dogs lick thy blood, even thine." This prediction was fulfilled – "So the king died; and the dogs licked up his blood according unto the word of the Lord." I Kings 22:37,38

Fire was called down from heaven to consume soldiers of Ahaziah. He had fallen and was very sick. Instead of inquiring from Elijah, God's prophet, about whether he would live or die, he sent to Baalzebub the god of Ekron and inquired. Because of this death was pronounced upon the king. "So he died according to the word of the Lord which Elijah had spoken." II Kings 1:17

God called upon Elijah to go to Jordan. Elisha was bound to go with him. Elijah took his mantle and wrapped it together and smote the waters, and they were divided hither and thither, so that they two went over on dry ground. It was right there that Elijah asked Elisha what he would have of him before he was taken away from him. Elisha requested a double portion of Elijah's spirit. He said, "thou hast asked a hard thing: nevertheless, if thou see me when I am taken from thee, it shall be so unto thee." And Elisha saw it. He cried and tore his own clothes in two pieces. He then took up the mantle of Elijah and went to the bank of Jordan. Taking the mantle he smote the waters, and said, "Where is the Lord God of Elijah?", and when he had smitten the waters, they parted hither and

Elijah (Elias) appeared with Jesus and Moses on the mountain of transfiguration (Matt. 17:3).

Eljiah and Enoch are the only two ever translated not to see death. They were taken into heaven directly from life and their physical bodies were changed into glorified ones for flesh and blood cannot inherit heaven.

What Saith The Scriptures?

The following questions have been sent in to be answered through this column.

QUESTION NO. 1: What is the bottom-less pit?

chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment." Contrary to natural prisons there is no escape from hell. No soul will ever leave hell except to be "judged every man according to their works," after which he will be cast soul and body, into the lake of fire, the second death, i.e. hell.

In hell will be torments, weeping, wailing and gnashing of teeth. Luke 16:19-31 gives us the unique account of two men's souls after death. The rich man, being unprepared to die, found himself "being in torments," saying "I am tormented in this flame." Hell is a place of torments designed by the all-powerful God. No words of any language have been able to describe the torments of hell. Perhaps our greatest understanding of hell comes as a feeling rather than an intellectual understanding. The burden a sinner feels is in a very small way a foretaste of the torments of hell. The Holy Spirit reproves the world of sin, pointing to the end or wages of sin which is death. To be saved the sinner must taste bitter repentence, or death to sin. The saint truly knows, from an experimental standpoint, what he was saved from - the eternal torments in hell.

While one of the chief joys in heaven will be the communion with God and fellow saints, hell will be a place of friendless companionship. Although we are told that "misery loves company," the rich man of Luke 16 sought a way that his brothers might avoid the torment he was experiencing. Hell will be populated with Satan, his angels, and the most unsavory characters the world has known. Revelation 21:8, "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death."

This rich man was told by Abraham to "remember that thou in thy lifetime..." Hell is a place of memory, conscience, and despair. The rich man remembered the opportunities he'd had in life to be saved from that torment. Certainly added to the torments of hell will be the remembrance of the trampled mercies of God. Memory of every rejected draw upon the heart by the Holy Spirit will taunt the tormented sinner.

The saint on earth lives by hope; a hope in an unfailing God. But the sinner in hell has no hope that Christ or any lesser being will ever come to hell to give opportunity to repent. Hell is filled with total and complete despair. Hell is the place of death, but where the finality of death refuses to come. Those there "shall be punished with *everlasting* destruction." Hell is eternal. Although the human mind cannot easily comprehend one

million years, if hell lasted for that period avoidance of being condemned there would be a trivial matter. But, hell does not end after any length of time. Time will come to an end, but hell will continue for eternity.

Much of mankind lives today as if they will live forever, will not ever face the judgment of God, and as if there is no such thing as the wrath of God. Nevertheless it is appointed unto man once to die, but after this the judgment, and those counted as wicked will face the wrath of God. All mankind would face this wrath except that God has made a way of escape through grace. But men cannot see their need of the grace of God until they have a spiritual understanding of the wages of sin which is eternal death in hell.

Hush-a-by Pulpits
