### THE LAST DAY

In the Genesis account of the beginning, we find the record of the first day as follows: "And God said, let there be light, and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. And God called the light day, and the darkness he called night. And the evening and the morning were the First day." Gen. 1:3-5.

We believe that the above scripture teaches that God created the first day, and since that day time has been counted, and we are now living in the process of time or days; we find the useage "in process of time" in the Bible a number of times. We also find these words in Genesis: While the earth remaineth, seed time and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease (Gen. 8:22). Now we know that as long as the earth remains, that we will have day and night.

Now if we can learn what the Bible says about the earth being destroyed, we will learn when the duration of days shall end. Please read the following scripture: "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up." II Peter 3:10. Again we find that time will be no longer. "And the angel which I saw stand upon the sea and upon the earth lifted up his hand to heaven, And sware by him that liveth forever and the things that therein are, and the earth and the things that therein are, and the sea, and the things which are therein, that there should be time no longer." Rev. 10:5-6. Paul tells us that the things that we see are temporal, "While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are

not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal (temporary); but the things which are not seen are eternal." II Cor. 4:18.

Again we find in the word of the Lord these words by Job, "So man lieth down, and riseth not: till the heavens be no more, they shall not awake, nor be raised out of their sleep." Job 14:12. Therefore, with these scriptures and many others that could be produced, we believe that this present world, Heaven and earth will pass away. So it is obvious that time will cease and that there will be a last day as sure as there was a first

Now we will notice just what will happen at the last day. First here is what Baptists have declared themselves to believe through the years gone by. "We believe that the end of this world is approaching; that at the Last Day Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the graves to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy, and that this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or (Continued on Page 4)

## DOUBLE MINDEDNESS

There is a condition in which a child of God can dwell in which he can find neither success in the work of the Lord nor happiness in the world. James wrote of it twice in his epistle. Double minded, as our King James Translation renders it, literally means two-souled. The word James used is a combination of the Greek word meaning two and "psuche," which is translated "soul" in the New Testament scriptures.

That we may better understand the seriousness of this condition, let us look at the way in which the inspired writer defines the man. Paul, in desiring complete sanctification (setting apart) to God of the Thessalonian church, wrote, ". . .your whole spirit (pneuma) and soul (psuche) and body (soma) be preserved blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus." 1 Thes. 5:23. Perhaps most of us have always thought of man in terms of two parts, combining soul and spirit into one and regarding the body as the other. For most considerations such a two-part division is adequate, but we must now consider that Paul wrote of the man in three parts, using three different words for description. Again, in the Hebrew letter, he writes of the "dividing asunder of soul and spirit" of man by the gospel sword. Hebrews 4:12. The spirit of man is that innermost part of him which is invisible and altogether intangible except to the touch of God. It is this part which is "born of God" within the body of a saved man. "That which is born of the Spirit is spirit." John 3:6. The regenerated human spirit "doth not commit sin" and "cannot sin because he is born of God." "His (God's) seed remaineth in him (the regenerated man)." 1 John 3:9.

There is also a part of each man which is a perpetual sinner as long as it lives in this world. Righteous and diligent Paul complained of it when he exclaimed, "O wretched man that I am! Who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" Romans 7:24.

Thus we have a part that does not practice sin against a part that can only stop sinning when constrained. If the spirit cannot be a party to sin, upon whose shoulders does the responsibility fall of determining whether the body will commit sin or refrain from sinning? It is this part called the soul that determines the course of a saved man's life.

If a child of God is living as God would have him to live, he will not be two-souled, that is, double minded. Although there will be a daily struggle with the desires of the "body of death," he who has but one determi-

nation in his soul, to serve God, will not be vexed with the torment of a vacillating mind. The worst part of the indecisive character of this child of God halted "between two opinions" is that he proves "unstable in all his ways." He remains without needed wisdom, and if he asks God for wisdom he asks with wavering mind. "Let not that man think that he shall receive anything of the Lord." "He is like a wave of the sea driven by the wind and tossed." James 1:5-8. Such a man is of no spiritual value to himself or to others. He cannot be depended upon because of his instability. Churches largely composed of such people are frequently fighting among themselves. The carnal mind is often given permission by the other side of the double mind. Worldliness and fleshliness increase among such churches and so do strife and pride. James accuses them of being adulterers and adulteresses because they cannot have one mind of love, and that toward God only. James offers the solution to those "sinners' and "double minded" brethren to whom he wrote; affliction of heart, mourning, weeping, sorrow, humbleness, and the forthcoming power of God. James 4:1-10.

How terrible it is in view of these words of God to be either carnal minded or double minded. Either condition is a ticket to failure in the Christian life. God will not share your choicest affections with anyone or anything. If you are so minded he will simply deny you his power and allow you to dwell in that unhappy state. He is happiest who has his single soul set on only one purpose in life, to serve God the best he can so long as he lives. Such a condition is a ticket to success, for God will surely bless it.

hell, on principles of righteousness." Pendleton Church Manual, page 60. Now to prove that God has appointed a day for the Lord to return we will look to the word of God. In the 24th chapter of Matthew, we find a question asked by the disciples as follows: "Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming and of the end of the world?" "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only." Matt. 24:36. Now notice the following scripture: "Because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he hath ordained." Acts 17:31.

Just as sure as the Bible speaks of a first day it speaks of a last day, and one could be as successful in arguing that there was a day before the first day as to urge that there will be a day after the last day. To further explain the last day I will give you an example. The Jews had a feast (festival) that lasted eight days (Lev. 23:36), and Jesus attended one during his life here on earth. Now, notice the following scripture: "In the LAST day, that great of feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink." John 7:37. Now if the eighth day was the last day of that feast then it would be silly to say there was another day. So then if God created the first day and has appointed the last day, why say there will be another

Christ is coming on the last day. The resurrection will take place on the last day. Judgment will be on the last day. The wicked and righteous will be separated on the last day. Then it follows that whatever happens after the last day will be in eternity. Please notice the following scriptures: "What saith the scriptures. I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick (living) and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom." II Tim. 4:1. "And this is the father's will which has sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the LAST DAY." "And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the LAST DAY." "No man can come to me except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the LAST DAY."

"Whoso eateth my flesh and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life, and I will raise him up at the LAST DAY." John 6:39-40, 44, 54.

Martha understood that the resurrection would occur on the last day as Jesus teaches in the verses above.

". . . .I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day." John 11:24.
