CROSSBEARERS MAKE GOOD SOLDIERS

"And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me." Jesus Christ (Matt. 10:38)

A fact which has been proven over a thousand times is our interest in a matter is always in direct proportion to our invesment. Fathers and mothers are greatly interested in their children because they have so much invested - life, love and provisions for their living.

No person has ever meant much to Christ unless that person has willingly borne a cross for his Lord. In Acts 13 we read about certain prophets and teachers who were members of the Antioch Church. These men were some of the pioneer crusaders for the mission efforts of the Kingdom. I would like for us to take a look at the life of a few of them.

Manaen

I wonder how many of you had ever noticed this name with any real interest. Quite frankly, I must admit that he was a stranger to me until just a few years ago. Manaen was one of the volunteers to do initial missionary work.

King Herod's son, Prince Herod, was given the customary choice of selecting a young boy from one of the peasants' families to be his playmate. Prince Herod chose Manaen. So he came to the palace to live with royalty. The two young boys played together, studied and learned together, and finally grew to manhood.

One day Manaen made a decision to leave the palace. He would go and serve for the man called Jesus. The details of this young man's salvation are not available, but you may rest assured he had for certain been with Jesus and found Him precious to his soul. He may have trusted in him when He was brought before Herod there at the palace.

Anyway, he's leaving idolatry to worship and serve the lowly One of Galilee.

I can just imagine Herod calling him in and saying, "Manaen, have you lost your mind? Is it true that you plan to join in with those who follow the poor carpenter who was crucified?" At this point Manaen had to choose whom he would serve and with whom he would associate. Some of you are perhaps faced with this same question right now. You

MISSION REPORT

Dear Fellow-Labourers,

This is the first of what I hope to be many reports on a new Mission in West Virginia. I call it new, but God has had it in the workings for a long while. As I reflect over my life and the events that have brought about this effort, I see the hand of God in every move and I marvel at his wonderful ways. This work is not a lone effort on my part nor is it a singluar undertaking of Old Time Missionary Baptist Church which has authorized it. This work is a part of all Gods Churches that have had a hand in the missionary outreach into W.V. and I personally would like to extend my deepest thanks to all involved.

This work may be different than most missionary endeavors in that I did not have to leave my home and family, I did not have to relocate nor did I have to quit my job. In August of 1982 we (Old Time Baptist Church) held a revival effort here in my hometown of Belmont, WV which is 3 counties and almost 50 miles removed for Old Times meeting place. To the natural eye that meeting didn't amount to much. In a county of 10,000 only 2 little 14 year old girls came to hear the Good News that Jesus saves inners. It was at the end of that revival that I cried to God and said now that Old Time has gone home who is going to teach them. The answer came from God like a sword to my spirit and He said "Thou art the man." To make a long story short, I ran from God for 8 months and after much misery I yielded to the call. Since that time I have had one purpose in mind and that is to preach Jesus Christ to my own people. I availed myself to the open door policy of local churches (all of them unsound) and preached in them until they wouldn't invite me back, I bought time on the local radio station and started a 30 min. program in order to get people familiar with my beliefs and my intentions, and I talked personally with as many people as possible. It has now been three years in preparation but thank God the time has come.

We had our first meeting on Friday night, February 28, 1986 in an old rented building that doesn't even have indoor plumbing and there were 33 people there. We met the next night March 1 and there were 35 present with 10 of those being different visitors than the night before. Regular services began on Sunday morning March 2 at 10:00 AM with an attendance of 16. (One of those was the same little girl that had attended in 1982) We have already had 3 different families say that they intend to come regularly because they say "we have never heard anything like this" and our prayer is that they will continue to like what they hear.

We believe God has a work to do here in Pleasants County and our hearts are full and open to the people, not just because they are our friends and relatives but because they, like all people everywhere, need salvation. We need and desire your earnest prayers. We will remain in this rented building until we can do better, and until my job frees me up in the evenings we will be limited to only Sunday morning services. As God gives more opportunity we will proceed and hopefully we will see many souls saved. We hope also to someday see a sound Baptist church here. PLEASE remember us in prayer and if you get the opportunity to come this way, stop and join us as we labour for our Lord. God be with you.

are God's servant following the crowd. I'd like to remind you that you surrendered all to be saved. But have you ever given up anything to serve your Saviour? Manaen did. He gave up royal friendships with royal fringe benefits to serve Him who gave life eternal. I believe Manaen's new friends meant more to him than those he sacrificed to follow Jesus.

Saul

"And there was a man by the name of Saul." This is the same as the apostle Paul. The Greek for "Saul" is "asked for" and for "Paul" is "little." God asked for this man to be a trail-blazer. He would be sent to the Gentiles with God's glorious gospel. What cross did he bear? He made a total surrender of his soul, mind and body to the Lord Jesus Christ. By surrender, I mean he gave up anything and everything that had been to his advantage in favor of looking for an advantage to Jesus. "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Gal. 6:14) Have you failed to really get involved with the work of our Lord? Jesus said, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself." (Matt. 16:24) Paul was small in physical stature, standing five feet and six inches, and weighing only a hundred and thirty pounds. Not many have ever been the crossbearer Paul was. God used him to write fourteen of the twenty-seven books of the New Testament. By his labors, at least thirteen new churches were planted. All of this was accomplished between imprisonments, beatings and a shipwreck. What a soldier!

Barnabas

What cross did this man bear? Nothing is said of his having many talents. Couldn't preach much. Was not very eloquent. The church ran into a financial crisis, and beacuse of Barnabas's genuine love for Jesus and His Church, he sold his farm and donated every cent to the church at Jerusalem. I've never personally known anyone who did such. Have you? Neither have I ever known in my life one man or woman in the church that was faithful, loving, devoted, soul-concerned and dedicated to the work of Christ who would not bear the cross of giving. Many of you will never be crusaders for Christ and won't really mean much to the church, because when it comes to giving money, you hold back. I do not wish to know who gives how much in the church I pastor. But I really believe that I could pick the givers pleasing God by their church attendance and interest in the Lord's work.

"Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6:21) It seems so easy for the Christians to sing "I Surrender All" for the invitation, but "Have Thine Own Way" at other times.

Niger

Do you remember reading about the man who was called to help carry Jesus's cross? His name was Simeon. Luke says of this man – "and Simeon that was called Niger." Could it be the same man who bore the actual cross of Jesus is alive and wanting to do more to help the Saviour's crusade. I believe it was.

The real point I want to make here is this – we need to go to Calvary often in our meditations that we might draw from that self-sacrificing scene. If in fact Niger did carry the cross, it must have surely strengthened his spiritual muscles. Jesus bore the cross of death for us. How many of us will bear a cross till the death for Him?
